RESOLUTIONS AUTHORIZING TWO (2) PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENTS FOR AS-NEEDED HYDROLOGY & CREEK RESTORATION DESIGN SERVICES WITH JONES & STOKES AND AMPHION ENVIRONMENTAL, INC., FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED TWO

HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$250,000) EACH

SUMMARY

Resolutions have been prepared authorizing the City Administrator, or her designee, to enter into professional services agreements to provide as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services with each of the following design firms:

- Jones & Stokes
- Amphion Environmental, Inc.

Each professional service agreement is for a not-to-exceed amount of \$250,000. The Public Works Agency, Project Delivery Division, will manage the contracts.

These as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services are needed to provide technical studies, design services and construction support services for various City projects related to creeks, storm drains, wetlands, and the waterfront. Typical projects include hydrology and geomorphology studies, biological assessments, creek restoration, creek bank stability projects, wetland restoration, stormwater treatment and detention, and other water-related projects.

The as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services for various improvement projects are consistent with the Mayoral and City Council Goal of "Maintaining and Enhancing Oakland's Physical Assets" by protecting and improving Oakland's waterways.

FISCAL IMPACT

Each agreement is for an amount not to exceed \$250,000, for a combined total of \$500,000 for both contracts. The as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services will be

required for projects funded by Measure DD (Oakland Trust for Clean Water and Safe Parks), Proposition 40 (2002 State Bond for Clean Air, Clean Water, and Safe Parks) and various other capital improvement funds and grants.

The approval of these contracts will not result in additional appropriation of funds. The services will be funded through the various individual projects. Funds will be identified prior to the performance of the design services.

BACKGROUND

The City issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services. Fourteen firms responded to the RFP. The Public Works Agency, Project Delivery Division, reviewed the proposals and short-listed seven firms based on the quality and content of the proposals. The short-listed firms were then interviewed and evaluated by a selection panel consisting of City staff from the Engineering Division and the Environmental Services Division, plus an outside community member. All panelists were experienced in hydrology and water quality issues. The evaluation criteria included the following:

- 1. Relevant experience;
- 2. Qualifications of project team and project manager;
- 3. Organization of firm, availability of resources and capability to meet project schedules;
- 4. Understanding of the design requirements for City projects; and
- 5. Ability to provide high quality customer service to the City and the community.

All seven firms were judged to be well-qualified, and the top five ranked firms received contracts with the City in the summer and fall of 2004. One firm has been unable to execute the contract due to corporation legal issues. The other four firms have been used for design work on various projects, including Measure DD creek and waterfront work.

Staff anticipates that the value limits of these four contracts will be reached in the near future, and there is a need for additional as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services. Staff is recommending that the City contract with the remaining two firms that were short-listed: Jones & Stokes and Amphion Environmental, Inc.

The two firms are qualified to provide as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services. Both are certified local or small local businesses and have exceeded the City's Local/Small Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) program requirements of 20% total local participation. The Contract Compliance Division of the City Administrator's Office has verified the LBE and SLBE information for each firm as shown on Attachment A.

Both firms have the technical expertise to perform the work required, and clearly demonstrated their understanding of the technical complexities and regulatory issues involved in implementing capital improvement projects along the City's waterways.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

It is anticipated that several capital improvement projects funded by Measure DD, Proposition 40 and various other capital improvement funds and grants will utilize the as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services agreements. Additionally, unscheduled projects will occur from time to time and will most likely require or benefit from these design services agreements. As-needed professional services agreements allow the City to promptly respond to urgent projects and provide the necessary design services in an efficient and timely manner. The agreements will also reduce staff time and costs when compared to an individual project-by-project request for proposal process.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic:</u> The projects will generate business tax, sales tax, and other revenues for the City by those firms who work on the project. Local businesses will be utilized on the projects and will benefit directly.

<u>Environmental</u>: The projects will protect and improve our creeks, wetlands, and shoreline, and wildlife habitat enhanced.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The proposed design services to the various projects will enhance the usage and quality of waterways in all parts of Oakland. Watershed-based planning of these projects will improve the social connections between the upstream and downstream neighborhoods.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

Consultants will be required to design the City improvements in compliance with the physical access requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act.

RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

As-needed professional services agreements will expedite the design of capital improvement projects. The time and costs currently expended in selecting consultants on a project-by-project basis will be reduced. Executing these contracts will allow the City to spread contract opportunities to all qualified local firms that were short-listed through a competitive RFP process.

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It is recommended that the City Administrator, or her designee, enter into professional services contracts to provide as-needed hydrology and creek restoration design services with each of the following two firms: 1) Jones & Stokes 2) Amphion Environmental, Inc. Each contract is for an amount not to exceed \$250,000.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that City Council approve the resolutions.
