AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE "STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION, 2003 EDITION" AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 12321 C.M.S. AND ALL RESOLUTIONS

RELATED THERETO

SUMMARY

An ordinance has been prepared adopting the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction (commonly known as the GREENBOOK), 2003 Edition. Adoption of this ordinance will replace the 2000 Edition of the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, which was adopted on April 24, 2001 by Ordinance No. 12321 C.M.S. Staff recommends that this ordinance take effect July 1, 2004.

FISCAL IMPACT

Contractors have typically purchased specifications at the time of bidding. Therefore, no additional costs will be incurred by the City as a result of this recommendation. There is no fiscal impact.

BACKGROUND

The GREENBOOK is a specialized document governing public works construction. This specification provides industry standard rules for construction management, as well as quality assurance and quality control procedures. A joint committee of the Southern California Chapter, American Public Works Association and Southern California Districts, Associated General Contractors of America updates the GREENBOOK every three years. The GREENBOOK is used by a large number of public agencies in California and has been the City of Oakland's standard specification document since 1969.

The legal aspects of the specifications have been reviewed and approved by the City Attorney's Office. When adopted, the 2003 Edition will become the official standard specification for both public works and private development improvements within the City of Oakland.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

The 2003 Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction includes revisions that reflect best practices of construction management and control. Adoption of the ordinance will assure Oakland's capital improvement projects are constructed in compliance with these standards.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

<u>Economic</u>: The adoption of the 2003 Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction will facilitate the economic construction of capital improvement projects within the City.

<u>Environmental</u>: Contract specifications require the contractor to provide a Job Site Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan and Summary Report. This plan will state how 50% or more of the anticipated amount of construction and demolition debris generated by the construction project will be diverted from landfills.

<u>Social Equity:</u> The adoption of the 2003 Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction will facilitate the construction of safe structures that benefit the neighborhoods and enhance the social equity of the residents of Oakland.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR CITIZEN ACCESS

There is no direct impact or benefit to seniors or people with disabilities.

RECOMMENDATION AND RATIONALE

It is recommended that the ordinance adopting the Standard Specifications for Public Works Construction, 2003 Edition, be approved.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the ordinance be approved.
