LOCAL 790; REPRESENTING EMPLOYEES IN REPRESENTATION UNIT SI1, (PART-TIME EMPLOYEES) COVERING THE PERIOD OF JULY 1, 2002 THROUGH

JUNE 30, 2008

SUMMARY

The City of Oakland has reached a tentative agreement on wages and other terms and conditions of employment with the City's Part-Time Employees represented by Service Employees International Union (SEIU), Local 790. Key provisions of the agreement include increases to salaries, consistent with full-time positions. The tentative agreement has a six year term, effective July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2008. Employees have voted to ratify the tentative agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT

The six-year tentative agreement has a cost of \$2,514,286 from July 1, 2002 through June 30, 2008. Details are provided below:

The costs by fiscal year are as follows:

FY 02-03:

\$625,569, including \$566,973 for wages and equity adjustments;

\$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

FY 03-04:

\$393,772, including \$335,175 for wages and equity adjustments;

\$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

FY 04-05:

\$151,208, including \$92,612 for wages and equity adjustments;

\$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

FY 05-06:


\$432,746, including \$374,149 for wages and equity adjustments;

\$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

FY 06-07:

\$447,712, including \$389,115 for wages and equity adjustments;

\$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

FY 07-08: \$463,277, including \$404,680 for wages and equity adjustments; \$58,597 for health and welfare premium.

There are sufficient appropriations to cover the costs of Memoranda of Understanding (MOU) wage and equity increases detailed above for FY 2003-05. Retroactive wages, including equity and premium increases for FY 2002-03 will be absorbed within existing Departmental budgets. **BACKGROUND**

This labor agreement represents the culmination of negotiations that began in October 2003 with representatives of the City's largest union (SEIU, Local 790) representing some 1,400 part-time employees. The City and Local 790 commenced negotiations in October 2003, to replace the prior Agreement which had expired on June 20, 2002. Negotiations were conducted from October, 2003 until late December, 2003. The Agreement was ratified by the Union, effective January 14, 2004. Items of significance contained in the Agreement include: general wage increases of 6 percent retroactive to July 6, 2002, 3 percent effective June 21, 2003, 1 percent effective July 3, 2004, 4 percent effective July 2, 2005, 4 percent effective July 1, 2006, and 4 percent effective June 30, 2007; an increase in the health and welfare premium by \$.10 per hour effective July 6, 2002, and a subsequent \$.10 increase per hour in each of the succeeding five years of the agreement.

DISCUSSION

This tentative agreement brings the salaries of part-time employees in line with their full-time counterparts. Like the full-time agreement, the six year term will aid the City's financial planning by providing certainty relative to expenditure increases due to increased salaries.

Finally, this tentative agreement updates the existing MOU to eliminate outdated language in order to streamline and ease contract administration, with the potential for reduced grievances and administrative costs. Also, the language in the MOU has been amended to make it consistent where practicable with other MOUs in order to ease administration.
