2024 Appropriations Limit Override Ballot Measure

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Background

- In 1979, Paul Gann sponsored Proposition 4, called the State Appropriations Limit (later amended by Proposition 111).
- The State <u>Appropriations</u> Limit, commonly referred to as the "GANN Limit", is a constitutional spending cap that limits state and local governmental spending of <u>proceeds of taxes</u>.





What are "Appropriations"?

- Appropriation can be defined as the sum of money set aside by formal action for a specific use¹; budget.
 - Example: Oakland City Council appropriated \$750,000 for the Direct Community Grant Program to award grants to various non-profits.


What are "Proceeds of Taxes"?

- Proceeds of Taxes can be defined as money collected or required to be collected on account of or pursuant to any tax².
 - Examples: Property tax, business license tax, sugar-sweetened beverage tax, and various local measures such as Parks Measure Q OPR Preservation, Litter Reduction, and Homelessness Support Act.

What does this really mean?

The GANN establishes a

ceiling/limit/maximum on the amount of tax collected revenue (tax proceeds) that can be formally set aside for a specified reason (appropriation).

Which tax proceeds are exempt from the limitation?

• Debt Service and Property appropriated to service voter-approved debt (Ex. Measure KK, DD, and U)

- Federal Mandates and Court Orders
- Qualified Capital Outlay
- Appropriations supported by increased gas taxes (Measure B & BB)
- Appropriations resulting from natural disasters





How do you calculate the Limit?

 The GANN Limit calculation utilizes Oakland's "base year" spending level (1987-88) which is then adjusted each year for the changes in population and per capita personal income³ to arrive at the current year's GANN

Why Now?

- The previously approved Gann Limit Override (Measure S), approved in March 2020, will sunset on March 3, 2024⁵.
- Without another measure increasing the appropriation limit, within two years the City could be restricted from spending voter-approved local tax measures.

- This measure will reaffirm Oakland voters' original approval to:
- Collect, appropriate, and expend proceeds of taxes from 12 voter approved measures including the Public Safety and Services Violence Prevention Act (Measure Z); and
- 2. Authorize an increase to the appropriations limit for an additional four years.
