The Committee Approved The Recommendation Of Staff As Amended And To Forward This Item To The March 6, 2024 Special City Council Agenda On Consent With The Following Amendments;

Of The Legislation, On Page 8 Section 7. Addition Of Section 8.02.072 (Verified Response Alarm Systems). To Read As Follows;

8.02.072 Verified Response Alarm Systems

Beginning July 1, 2024, It Shall Be Unlawful For An Alarm Business To Make An Alarm Dispatch Request Based On The Breach Of A Single Major Point Of Entry Without A Secondary Indication That A Burglary Is In Progress. Secondary Indication May Be Audio Or Video Evidence Of An Intrusion, The Tripping Of A Motion Detector, Or Verbal Confirmation From The Alarm User Or Designee, In Addition To The Breach Of A Major Point Of Entry. An Alarm Business Who Violates This Section Shall Be Subject To A \$1,000 Penalty For Each Violation. This Section Shall Not Apply To Alarm Systems Installed Prior To July 1, 2024, Which Lack Secondary Verification Capacity, For Which The Users Have Continually Maintained An Active Permit Unless The Alarm Business Has, Made Two Alarm Dispatch Requests For The Property Based On A False Alarms, At Any Time After July 1, 2024.

- How Verified Response Has Impacted Other Cities That Have Adopted It.
- How Are Alarms Categorize By OPD Priority 1, 2, or 3.
- Does OPD Have An Internal Policy Categorizing False Alarms After A Prior False Alarm.
