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A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE A SECOND CHANCE ACT JUVENILE OFFENDER REENTRY GRANT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$750,000 FROM THE U.S DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, OFFICE OF JUVENILE JUSTICE AND DELINQUENCY PREVENTION AND TO ENTER INTO VARIOUS GRANT AGREEMENTS FOR ONE YEAR WITH VARIOUS PUBLIC AND NON PROFIT PARTNERS NAMED IN THE GRANT FOR AN ESTIMATED AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$660,595 FROM OCTOBER 1, 2010 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2011

WHEREAS, City of Oakland voters passed Measure Y, the Violence Prevention and Public Safety Act of 2004, in November 2004, approving a series of taxes to support violence prevention objectives, programs and services to reduce violence among children, youth and young adults in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland in Alameda County, California confronts some of the nation's most critical juvenile crime and recidivism challenges; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland through Measure Y currently funds the Juvenile Justice Center and Oakland Unified School District Wraparound Services operating at the Juvenile Justice Center; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services applied for and received a grant for \$750,000 from the U.S Department Of Justice, Office Of Juvenile Justice And Delinquency Prevention Grant for a Second Chance Act Juvenile Offender Reentry Grant to enhance the current Measure Y funded Juvenile Justice Strategy from October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011 with an option for a no cost extension; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services (DHS) desires to enter into grant agreements for \$168,000 with the five current Juvenile Justice Wraparound providers: The Mentoring Center, East Bay Asian Youth Center, East Bay Agency for Children, Youth Uprising, and California Youth Outreach with each agency receiving \$33,600, to add .5 FTE Case Manager to enhance and expand service to youth being released from The Juvenile Justice Center. Additional funding to these agencies will be contingent upon their meeting the set deliverables and all set performance measures; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into a grant agreement with Alameda County Health Care Services Agency to provide mental health motivational training, mental health supervisor training, co-occurring technical assistance, coaching, parenting skill training to the JJC partners, and provide training for probation staff in an amount not to exceed \$221,595 in which HCSA will subcontract with agencies to be determined by a Competitive Request for Proposal Process; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services desires to enter into a grant agreement with Oakland Unified School District to provide funding for 0.8 FTE Education Assessment Coordinator to provide assessments of juvenile detainees prior to placement in an amount not to exceed \$60,000; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services desires to contract with Resource Development Associates, West ED, and CitySpan to provide evaluation services in an amount not to exceed \$67,000 and will determine the precise allocation to each partner at a later date without returning to council; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services desires to enter into a grant agreement with Bay Area Legal Aid to provide various specific case managers working on the Juvenile Justice Strategy for in amount not to exceed \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services desires to enter into a grant agreement with Alameda County Probation to provide funding for 1.0 FTE Probation Transition Lead and provide training for probation staff in an amount not to exceed \$151,400 for one year; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services will use \$57,005 to support contract administration; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to accept and appropriate the aforesaid grant in the amount of \$750,000 and appropriate it to the City of Oakland, Department of Human Services to implement a comprehensive System of Community Reentry Support for Juvenile Offenders; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to accept and appropriate any additional funding related to this grant that may become available; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to accept and appropriate the aforesaid grant in the amount of \$750,000 into Department of Human Services Fund (2112), DHS Administration Organization (78111), Project to be Determine, and Fostering Safe and Healthy Communities Program (SC22); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to execute and enter into grant agreements or contracts with the following agencies: Alameda County Health Care Services Agency (ACHCSA) for \$221,595, Alameda County Probation for \$151,400, Oakland Unified School District for \$60,000, Bay Area Legal Aid for \$25,000, Resource Development Associates, West ED, and CitySpan for \$67,000, and to allocate \$168,000 for case management services to be divided between The Mentoring Center, East Bay Asian Youth Center, East Bay Agency for Children, Youth Uprising, California Youth Outreach with each agency receiving \$33,600, and that \$57,005 will be use by DHS to support contract administration, without returning to council, for the period October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That or the professional services contracts for evaluation services authorized by this Resolution, pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code Section 2.04.051.B and based on the information set forth in the City Administrator's report accompanying this resolution and presented at the public meeting(s) on this matter, the City Council finds and determines that is in the City's best interests to waive the competitive request for proposal process and so waives; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to accept and appropriate any additional funding related to this grant that may become available without returning to council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is hereby authorized to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments, modifications, payment requests and related actions which may be necessary in accordance with its basic purpose; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That said agreement shall be approved as to form and legality by the Office of the City Attorney and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
