RESOLUTION NO. 88951 C.M.S.

RESOLUTION:

- 1. ACCEPTING ANTI-POVERTY COMMUNITY SERVICES BLOCK GRANT (CSBG) IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE MILLION, THREE HUNDRED, NINETY-ONE THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED SIXTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$1,391,569) AWARDED BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT FOR THE JANUARY 1, 2022 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2022 PROGRAM YEAR ("2022 CSBG PROGRAM YEAR");
- 2. AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 88717 C.M.S., WHICH ADOPTED THE FISCAL YEAR 2021-23 BIENNIAL BUDGET, TO DECREASE THE AMOUNT OF CSBG FUNDS APPROPRIATED FOR THE 2022 CSBG PROGRAM YEAR BY FOUR THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED EIGHTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$4,589);
- 3. AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE TO ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE ANY ADDITIONAL CSBG FUNDS AWARDED BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES AND DEVELOPMENT FOR THE 2022 CSBG PROGRAM YEAR, WITHOUT RETURNING TO COUNCIL;
- 4. AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE TO AMEND EXISTING CSBG AGREEMENTS TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT AND EXTEND THE TERM AS AUTHORIZED BY ANY ADDITIONAL CSBG AWARD DURING 2022 CSBG PROGRAM YEAR, WITHOUT RETURNING TO COUNCIL; AND
- 5. AUTHORIZING THE USE OF GENERAL PURPOSE FUNDS TO PAY THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT CENTRAL SERVICES OVERHEAD CHARGES FOR 2022 CSBG PROGRAMS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$144,777).

WHEREAS, Calendar year 2021 marks the 50th Anniversary of the City of Oakland's Community Action Agency who has been fighting poverty by *Helping People...Changing Lives*; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland has received Anti-Poverty Federal Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding since 1971; and WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) has awarded CSBG funding in the amount of One Million Three Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Nine Dollars (\$1,391,569) to the Alameda County-Oakland Community Action Partnership (AC-OCAP) for anti-poverty programming for the January 1, 2022 – December 31, 2022 CSBG program year ("2022 CSBG Program Year"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland, on behalf of AC-OCAP, wishes to accept the CSBG funding in the amount of One Million Three Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Nine Dollars (\$1,391,569) for the 2022 CSBG Program Year; and

WHEREAS, these grant funds will be used to provide program administrative support and direct services to low-income individuals and families in Oakland and Alameda County (excluding Berkeley) to help them become self-sufficient as outlined in the State-approved 2022-2023 AC-OCAP Plan; and

WHEREAS, services provided will be in accordance with Federal and State subcontractor provisions, regulations, and guidelines for eligible activities under the CSBG program; and

WHEREAS, the City's Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-23 Adopted Biennial Budget appropriates an anticipated award of CSBG funds in the amount of One Million Three Hundred Ninety-Six Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Eight Dollars (1,396,158) to the Department of Health and Human Services Fund (2128), CSBG - Programs (78361/78362/78363) CAP/CSBG 2022 Program Project (1005640/1005641); and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the adopted budget to reflect the Four Thousand Five Hundred Eighty-Nine dollar (\$4,589) decrease in CSBG funds awarded by CSD for the 2022 CSBG Program Year; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, 2020, City Council adopted Resolution No. 88089 C.M.S., which awards grant agreements to multiple public and private non-profit organizations to provide direct services to eligible low-income individuals and families and authorizes the procurement of advertising and marketing services for the CSBG program for the January 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020 CSBG program year; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 88089 C.M.S. also authorizes renewal of the grant agreements and procurement contracts on the same terms for the January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 and January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 CSBG program years, subject to fund availability; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 88089 C.M.S., AC-OCAP intends to renew the following anti-poverty grant agreements and procurement contracts using the CSBG funds awarded for the 2022 CSBG Program Year:

WHEREAS, it is common for the CSD to award additional CSBG funds and extend the deadline for expenditures of said funds during the program year; and

WHEREAS, the CSBG funds can be spent more efficiently if the City Administrator or designee is authorized to make mid-year amendments to existing agreements to increase the amount and extend the term as authorized by any additional CSBG awards by the CSD; and

WHEREAS, due to the State-imposed 12% administrative expenses cap, the Human Services Department (HSD) is requesting a contribution from the General Purpose Fund in the amount of One Hundred Forty-Four Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventy-Seven dollars (\$144,777) for HSD's Central Services Overhead charges for the 2022 CSBG Program Year, as approved in the City's FY 2021-23 Adopted Biennial Budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby accepts the CSBG funds in the amount of One Million Three Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Nine Dollars (\$1,391,569) awarded by the California Department of Community Services and Development for the 2022 CSBG Program Year; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That Resolution No. 88717 C.M.S., which adopted the City's FY 2021-23 Biennial Budget, is amended to reduce the appropriation of CSBG funds to Human Services Fund (2128), CSBG - Programs (78361/78362/78363), CAP/CSBG 2022 Program Project (1005640/1005641) to One Million, Three Hundred Ninety-One Thousand, Five Hundred Sixty-Nine dollars (\$1,391,569), to reflect the Four Thousand, Five Hundred Eighty-Nine dollar (\$4,589) decrease in CSBG funds awarded by the California Department of Community Services and Development; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or their designee is authorized to accept and appropriate to Human Services Fund (2128), CSBG - Programs (78361/78362/78363), CAP/CSBG 2022 Program Project (1005640/1005641) any additional CSBG funds awarded by the California Department of Community Services and Development for the 2022 CSBG Program Year, without returning to Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or their designee is authorized to amend existing CSBG agreements to increase the amount and extend the term as authorized by any additional CSBG award during 2022 CSBG Program Year, without returning to Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That City Council hereby authorizes the use of General Purpose Funds to pay the Department of Human Services Central Services Overhead charges for the 2022 CSBG Program Year in the amount of One Hundred Forty-Four Thousand, Seven Hundred Seventy-Seven dollars (\$144,777), as approved in the City's FY 2021-23 Adopted Biennial Budget; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to conduct all negotiations; execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments and payment requests, and to take any other action consistent with this Resolution and its basic purpose; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That prior to execution, all agreements, including amended agreements, shall be reviewed and approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney, and executed copies shall be filed with the City Clerk.
