EMERGENCY ORDINANCE ADDING OAKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 8,86 TO REQUIRE PROOF OF A COVID-19 VACCINATION FOR PATROMS AT THE FOLLOWING INDOOR PUBLIC LOCATIONS: ESTABLISHMENTS OR EVENTS WHERE FOOD OR DRINK IS SERVED INCLUDING RESTAURANTS, BANS, COFFEE HOUSES, CILIES, AND BANQUET HALLS; (2) ENTERTAINMENT VENUES, THEATERS, CONCERT VENUES, MUSEUMS, AND RECREATION FACILITIES; (3) GYMS, FITNESS CENTERS AND YORA STUDIOS; (4) SENIOR CENTER PROGRAMS; (5) CITY HALL; AND (6) LARGE INDOOR EVENTS AT CITY AND PRIVATELY-OWNED FACILITIES

PRIVATELY- OWNED FACILITIES

This Emergency Ordinance (Ordinance) adds Oakland Municipal Code Chapter 9.68 to require certain indoor businesses and locations, designated as "Covered Locations, to require patrons to show proof of a COVID-19 vaccination Additionally, this same requirement applies to and the Cakland City Hall. These locations include establishments or events where food or drink is served including Restaurants, Bars, Coffee Houses, Clubs, and Banquet halls; (2) Entertainment Venues, Theaters, Concert Venues, Museums, and Recreation facilities; (3) Gyms, Fitness Centers and Yoga Studios; (4) Senior Adult Care facilities and City senior center programs; and Likewise, the proof of vaccine requirement applies to Patrons visiting City Hall, and Large Indoor Events. Large Indoor Events Large Indoor Events are defined as an indoor event with more than five hundred attendees.

The Ordinance provides that enforcement will be conducted pursuant to Civil Penalties and Administrative Penalties. It also provides the City Administrator with authority to promulgate Rules and Regulation for clarification and enforcement of the Ordinance and requires the City Administrator to provide the public with notice of the new rules, including summaries of the ordinance and related informational documents. The Ordinance will expire when the City of Oakland's Declaration of Emergency in response to COVID-19 is lifted.
