OAKLAND CITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. <u>89097</u> C.M.S.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO:

- 1) ENTER INTO A THREE-YEAR AGREEMENT WITH CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION (CDCR) AND ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE APPROXIMATELY THREE MILLION NINE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$3,956,522) ANNUALLY TO IMPLEMENT GOLDEN STATE WORKS TRANSITIONAL EMPLOYMENT AND JOB PLACEMENT SERVICES FOR OAKLAND RESIDENTS ON PAROLE; AND
- 2) RENEW THE AGREEMENT WITH CDCR AND ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE UP TO FOUR MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,500,000) FOR A FOURTH YEAR OF FUNDING IF AVAILABLE; AND
- 3) ENTER INTO A THREE-YEAR GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CENTER FOR EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES (CEO), IN AN ANNUAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO DOLLARS (\$3,781,572) TO PROVIDE JOB PLACEMENT SERVICES, FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED ELEVEN MILLION THREE HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$11,344,716); AND
- 4) AMEND THE GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CEO TO ADD A FOURTH YEAR FOR AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FOUR MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,300,000) IF CDCR AWARDS ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR A TOTAL GRANT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FIFTEEN MILLION SIX HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$15,644,716); AND

5) ACCEPT AND APPROPRIATE ANY ADDITIONAL FUNDS THAT BECOME AVAILABLE FROM CDCR WITHIN THE AGREEMENT TERMS OF JULY 1, 2022 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025, FOR THE SAME PURPOSES, AND AMEND THE GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CEO TO INCREASE THE GRANT AMOUNT

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland as part of its overall violence prevention strategy, has supported transitional reentry employment upon returning home in Oakland as a key element; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland is home to an estimated 800 individuals on State parole who frequently have substantial employment barriers; and

WHEREAS, the Department Violence Prevention (DVP) through the Public Safety and Services Act of 2014 (Safety and Services Act) provides a grant for a work crew, transitional employment program for high risk individuals and has found the strategy to be successful; and

WHEREAS, DVP has negotiated a three-year agreement with the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR), for approximately \$11,842,572 to implement the Golden State Works (GSW) program from July 1,2022 through June 30, 2025 for individuals on parole providing litter abatement and other maintenance services on Caltrans right-of-way in the Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, DVP anticipates that additional funds and/or a renewal for a fourth year of funding from CDCR may be negotiated; and

WHEREAS, DVP has identified an experienced, appropriate service provider to manage and implement the GSW transitional job program model through a Request for Proposal process in the past who continues to operate the model with strong outcomes; and

WHEREAS, DVP seeks to enter into a grant agreement with Center for Employment Opportunities (CEO); now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to enter into a three-year agreement with CDCR from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025 for receipt of approximately Three Million Nine Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Five Hundred Twenty-two Dollars (\$3,956,522) annually; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That pending available funds from CDCR, the City Administrator is authorized to amend the agreement with CDCR to accept a fourth year of funding in an amount not to exceed Four Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000) for FY 2025-2026; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the CDCR funds will be appropriated in the California Board of Corrections Fund (2152), Oakland Unite Organization (70211), FY 2022-2025 CDCR/GSW Project (TBD), FY 2022-2025 Caltrans Project (TBD), and Fostering Safe and Healthy Communities Program (SC22); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator is authorized to enter into a

grant agreement with Center for Employment Opportunities (CEO) in an amount not to exceed Three Million Seven Hundred Eighty-One Thousand Five Hundred Seventy-Two Dollars (\$3,781,572) annually for a total amount not to exceed Eleven Million Three Hundred Forty-Four Thousand Seven Hundred Sixteen Dollars (\$11,344,716) to provide a work crew model that includes job readiness training, job placement, and job retention services for people on parole from July 1,2022 through June 30, 2025; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That if a fourth year of funds become available from CDCR the City Administrator is authorized to accept and appropriate the funds and amend the above-referenced grant agreement with CEO to increase the grant amount by an amount not to exceed Four Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,300,000) and extend the grant term to add a fourth year to the grant term for a total grant amount not to exceed Fifteen Million Six Hundred Forty-four Thousand Seven Hundred Sixteen Dollars (\$15,644,716); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That if additional funds become available from CDCR for the same purposes during the grant term the City Administrator is authorized to accept and appropriate the funds and amend the above-referenced grant agreement with CEO to increase the grant amount during the July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2025 time period; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That grant recipient, "CEO," shall partner with local community-based organizations with specialized experience in supporting re-entry populations, workforce development, and job matching, to include, for program participants, additional assistance in obtaining permanent jobs, and providing other support and connections for program participants; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council authorizes the City Administrator to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents, including but not limited to application, agreements, amendments, modifications, payment requests and related actions which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned grant without returning to Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That said grant agreements and contracts shall be approved as to form and legality by the Office of the City Attorney and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
