INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER TREVA REID

RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND LASTING LEGACY EAST BAY LEGEND AND GLOBAL ICON, FORMER OAKLAND RAIDERS HEAD COACH JOHN MADDEN AND APPOINTING APRIL 10, 2022 AS JOHN MADDEN DAY IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND

WHEREAS, Coach John Madden was born in Austin, Minnesota on April 10, 1936 and was raised in Daly City, California. He went on to play for the offensive and defensive lines for California Polytechnic State University from 1957-1958 and earned his Bachelor's and Master's degrees from that institution; and

WHEREAS, Coach Madden was selected to go to the all-conference team and from there, he was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles. Unfortunately, a knee injury would end his hopes of a professional football career. Instead, Madden got into coaching, first at Hancock Junior College and then as defensive coordinator at San Diego State University; and

WHEREAS, Al Davis brought Coach Madden to the Oakland Raiders as a linebacker's coach in 1967, and the Oakland Raiders went to the Super Bowl in his first year with the team. Coach Madden replaced John Rauch as head coach after the 1968 season at the age 32, beginning a remarkable, unprecedented 10-year run. With his demonstrative demeanor on the sideline and disheveled look, Madden was the ideal coach for the collection of castoffs and misfits that comprised the Oakland Raiders at that time; and

WHEREAS, Coach Madden coached the likes of: Daryl (The Mad Bomber) Lamonica, Old Man Willie Brown, Jim Otto, Kenny (The Snake) Stabler, Jack (The Assassin) Tatum, George (The Hitman) Atkinson, Fred Biletnikoff, Cliff Branch (Speed Kills), Gene Upshaw, Art Shell, Dave (The Ghost) Casper, John (The Tooz) Matuszak, Lester (The Judge) Hayes, and many more; and

- WHEREAS, Coach Madden's career was unprecedented, holding the best Winning Percentage over his tenure of 10 years, the Best Monday Night Football record during his tenure, coaching some of the NFL's most memorable games ever, that also brought changes to the rules of the NFL: The Heidi Game, The Immaculate Reception (Deception), The Sea of Hands Game, The Holy Roller & The Ghost to the Post; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coach Madden's Greatest achievement was delivering Oakland it's 1st Super Bowl XI on Sunday, January 9, 1977, with a victorious win against the Minnesota Vikings, 32-14; and
- **WHEREAS**, Sports Illustrated ranked Coach John Madden's 1976 1977 Oakland Raiders, as the Best NFL Team for a season of All Time, posting a 13-1 Record and Super Bowl XI victory; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coach Madden's status as Oakland & Global Icon continued to grow after he retired as the Oakland Raiders head coach in 1979 and joined CBS. In his time as a broadcaster, he won 16 Emmy Awards and became known for his exuberant calls combined with simple explanations; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coach Madden was the preeminent television sports analyst for three decades, covering 11 Super Bowls for four networks from 1979-2009. Play-by-play announcer Al Michaels would share that "no one has made the sport more interesting, more relevant and more enjoyable to watch and listen to than John," and
- WHEREAS, Coach Madden educated a football nation with his use of the telestrator on broadcasts; entertained millions with his interjections of "Boom!" and "Doink!" throughout games and was an omnipresent pitchman selling restaurants, hardware stores and beer; and
- **WHEREAS**, it is hard to think about Coach Madden without thinking about the *TURDUCKEN*. The iconic culinary wonder, made up of a deboned chicken, stuffed inside a deboned duck, stuffed inside a deboned turkey, which was a staple of the late broadcaster and NFL legend for NFL Games played on Thanksgiving; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coach Madden's global legacy grew even more, touching all generations, and sports lovers everywhere, as the face of "Madden NFL Football," via EA Sports, one of the most successful sports video games of all-time.
- **WHEREAS**, Coach John Madden was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on August 5, 2006; and
- **WHEREAS**, Coach Madden and his wife Virginia made Pleasanton their home in 1967 and became a prominent couple in the community throughout the decades; and

WHEREAS, Coach Madden passed on at his home in Pleasanton, on December 28, 2021, at the age of 85. In a press release announcing Madden's passing, NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell said that Madden "was football", adding, "there will never be another John Madden, and we will forever be indebted to him for all he did to make football and the NFL what it is today."; and

WHEREAS, The Madden Family are very grateful for the leadership of Making Oakland Better, Forever Oakland Inc., for assisting in making Coach Madden's legacy cemented in Oakland forever, on Coach Madden's birthday April 10th, every year; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That Councilmember Treva Reid for the 7th District, on behalf of the Oakland City Council, do hereby recognize April 10, 2022, and each year after, as John Madden Day in the City of Oakland.
