*J. Indoor Event means an indoor event with two thousand and five hundred (2,500) or more attendees. A Large Indoor Event includes conventions, conferences, expos, concerts, shows, nightclubs, sporting events, live events and entertainment, fairs, festivals, and large private events or gatherings such as weddings. Large Indoor Events may have either assigned or unassigned seating, and may be either general admission or gated, ticketed, and permitted events. Large Indoor Events do not include government-sponsored public meetings.*

*8.68.40 - Face Mask Required to Attend a Large Indoor Event*

*This requirement to wear a face mask to attend a Large Indoor Event pursuant to Section 8.68.040 shall expire on November 1, 2022, or upon the lifting of the City's Administrator's Declaration of Local Emergency in response to the spread of COVID-19 that was issued March 9, 2020 and ratified by the City Council on March 12, 2020 pursuant to Resolution No. 8807S C.M.S. whichever occurs sooner.*
