#### Section 4: Provision of Face Masks At City Facilities

The City Administrator shall provide quality face masks (N95/KN95/KF94 or the equivalent) for individuals entering indoor City facilities that are open to the public.

#### Section S.68.020

J. Indoor Event means an indoor event with two thousand and five hundred (2,500) or more attendees. A Large Indoor Event includes conventions, conferences, expos, concerts, shows, nightclubs, sporting events, live events and entertainment, fairs, festivals, and large private events or gatherings such as weddings. Large Indoor Events may have either assigned or unassigned seating, and may be either general admission or gated, ticketed, and permitted events. Large Indoor Events do not include government-sponsored public meetings.
