## RESOLUTION CELEBRATING CITY OF OAKLAND DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DIRECTOR RYAN RUSSO FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND

**WHEREAS,** Council President Nikki Fortunato Bas would like to take the opportunity celebrate City of Oakland Department of Transportation (OakDOT) Director Ryan Russo for his service to the city of Oakland and congratulate him on his career transition; and

**WHEREAS,** Director Ryan Russo began his service with the City of Oakland in 2017 and was the first permanent director of OakDOT, leading a team of more than 350 public servants to envision, plan, build, operate and maintain a transportation system for the City of Oakland and assure safe, equitable, and sustainable access and mobility for residents, businesses and visitors; and

**WHEREAS,** Director Ryan Russo led the Department in delivering over two times the miles of paving than ever before, while receiving national recognition for integrating equity metrics into prioritization methods; and

WHEREAS, Director Ryan Russo set the vision to embrace new mobility while setting policies to promote and encourage their equitable deployment; and

WHEREAS, Director Ryan Russo crafted and launched the first Slow Streets program, closing over 25 miles of streets for socially distanced recreation and active transportation space during the COVID-

19 pandemic, gaining international recognition and encouraging numerous jurisdictions to follow; and

WHEREAS, Director Ryan Russo has served as a mentor to colleagues of color, helping to break

down barriers to facilitate more diverse and representative future planners, engineers and public servants;

and

WHEREAS, Director Ryan Russo has made tremendous strides for Oaklanders through his

tireless work to improve the safety, equity, and vibrancy of the transportation network; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland and its residents have benefited tremendously from his

leadership and are a healthier, safer, more equitable city because of it; now, therefore, be it
