President Fortunato Bas and Members of the City Council:

Pursuant to Section 401 of the Charter, the City Attorney has prepared and requests your approval of a resolution authorizing compromise and settlement of the above-entitled lawsuit for the sum of: One Million Five Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$1,525,000.00), payable to the settling plaintiffs in a manner specified by Plaintiffs' counsel.

Plaintiffs are 27 persons and two organizations that sued the City, former Interim Chief of Police Susan Manheimer, and three police officers, challenging the handling of protests in Oakland between May 29, 2020 and June 1, 2020. Plaintiffs claim violation of their right to free speech under the First Amendment, excessive force and false arrest in violation of the Fourth Amendment, violation of the right to substantive due process under the Fourteenth Amendment, violation of the Bane Act (Civ. Code § 52.1), and common law claims for assault and battery, false arrest, and negligence. The district court previously entered a preliminary injunction against the City, restricting certain elements of the City's crowd control policy and practices. Certain claims for injunctive relief have been certified as a class action, and the settlement of the claims for permanent injunctive relief and attorneys' fees must be approved by the Court.
