RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF JORGE LERMA, KYM JOHNSON, TIFFANY LASCADO, JESSICA JUNG, CYNTHIA ADAMS, CLARISSA DOUTHERD, DELTRINA JOHNSON, JULISSA PEREZ LIMA, DANA CILONO, KAREEM WEAVER, PRIYA JAGANNATHAN, EDGAR RODRIGUEZ-RAMIREZ, MELANIE MOORE, LANGE LUNTAO, AND BERNADETTE ZERMENO AS MEMBERS OF THE CHILDREN'S INITIATIVE CITIZENS' OVERSIGHT COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Oakland Children's Initiative was a 2018 Charter Amendment passed by the citizens of Oakland to deepen early investment in children and support them through college graduation through a 30-year parcel tax; and

WHEREAS, the Oakland Children's Initiative (Oakland City Charter, Art. XVI), established the Children's Initiative Citizens' Oversight Commission to provide oversight, accountability, and analysis for the distribution of funds and execution of programming; and

WHEREAS, Section 1601(b) of the City Charter provides that the Citizens' Oversight Commission shall be composed of nine (9) to fifteen (15) members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council pursuant to Section 601 of the Charter; and

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Section 1601(b) of the City Charter provides that the Mayor shall request recommendations from members of the City Council and the Oakland Unified School District Board of Education and Superintendent at least fourteen (14) days prior to submitting any appointments for confirmation for the Citizens' Oversight Commission; and

WHEREAS, Section 1601(b) of the City Charter provides that the composition of the Commission should be reflective of the diversity of Oakland and shall include the following members:

- (1) at least one (1) member with professional expertise in early childhood education policy;
- (2) at least one (1) member with professional expertise in, or who is a provider of, early childhood care or education;
- (3) at least one (1) member with at least two (2) years of experience teaching in early childhood education;
- (4) at least one (1) member with at least two (2) years of experience teaching TK-12, or who has professional expertise in TK-12 education or college access;
- (5) at least one (1) member with professional expertise in college completion, college or university leadership, or support for traditionally underrepresented college students;
- (6) at least one (1) member with experience in budgeting, auditing, finance, or early asset building;
- (7) at least one (1) member of a union or labor advocacy group who is employed by the City of Oakland Head Start, the Oakland Unified School District, or a participating early care and education provider;
- (8) at least one (1) homeowner who is subject to the parcel tax imposed by Section 5 of the Act;
- (9) at least one (1) parent, who presently has, or has had within five (5) years from the time of appointment, a child of preschool age who attended a preschool program benefiting from public subsidy, or who was on a waitlist for such a program; And
- (10) at least one (1) member who is, or who within five (5) years from the time of appointment was, enrolled in an Oakland public school, or who has graduated from an Oakland public school and enrolled in college within five (5) years from the time of appointment, or who is the first in their immediate family to graduate from College; and

WHEREAS, Section 1601(c) of the City Charter provides that a majority of the members of the Commission shall be residents of Oakland, and that the members in paragraphs (7) through (10) above must be residents of Oakland, and the members set forth in paragraphs (1) through (6) above must reside and/or work in Oakland, and at least one (1) member in paragraphs (1) or (2) above must be an employee of the Oakland Unified School District, and that one member may satisfy more than one of the requirements set forth in paragraphs (1) through (10) above; and

WHEREAS, Section 1601(d) of the City Charter provides that a member shall serve no more than four (4) full, consecutive terms, and for the initial nine (9) appointments only, one-third (1/3) of the members shall be appointed to serve for four (4) years, one-third (1/3) shall be appointed to serve for three (3) years, and one-third (1/3) shall be appointed to serve for two (2) years, and subsequently, all terms shall be for three (3) years; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Libby Schaaf has appointed Jorge Lerma, Kym Johnson, Tiffany Rose Lacsado, Jessica Jung, Cynthia Adams, Clarissa Doutherd, Deltrina Johnson, Julissa Perez Lima, Dana Cilono, Kareem Weaver, Priya Jagannathan, Edgar Rodriguez-Ramirez, Melanie Moore, Lange Luntao, and Bernadette Zermeno, subject to confirmation by the City Council; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That pursuant to City Charter sections 1601 and 601, the City Council confirms these mayoral appointments to the Children's Initiative Citizens' Oversight Commission as follows:

Kym Johnson, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education policy, early childhood education, and budgeting, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Deltrina Johnson, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and early childhood education, and who has at least two years of experience teaching in early childhood education, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Tiffany Rose Lacsado, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and early asset building, and who has had within five years a child of preschool age who attended a preschool program benefiting from public subsidy, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Jorge Lerma, as an Oakland resident and homeowner who has professional expertise in early childhood education and has at least two years of experience teaching in early childhood education and TK-12, to serve a four-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2026;

Cynthia Adams, who has professional expertise in college access and college completion, to serve a four-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2026;

Clarissa Doutherd, as an Oakland resident who has professional expertise in early childhood education and budgeting, to serve a four-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2026;

Kareem Weaver, as an Oakland worker with professional expertise in TK-12 education, to serve a two-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2024;

Lange Luntao, as an Oakland worker with professional expertise in early childhood education policy, TK-12 education, college completion, and budgeting to serve a two-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2024;

Melanie Moore, as an Oakland resident and homeowner with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and budgeting to serve a two-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2024;

Jessica Jung, as an Oakland resident and homeowner with at least two years of experience teaching TK-12, is a member of a union, and is employed by the Oakland Unified School District, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Julissa Perez Lima, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education, with at least two years of experience teaching in early childhood education, and who is

the first in their immediate family to graduate from College, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Dana Cilono, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education policy, early childhood education, TK-12 education, and budgeting, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Priya Jagannathan, as an Oakland worker with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and budgeting, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025;

Edgar Rodriguez-Ramirez, as an Oakland worker with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and TK-12 education, who is a member of a union, and is employed by the Oakland Unified School District, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025; and

Bernadette Zermeno, as an Oakland resident with professional expertise in early childhood education policy and early childhood education and who has at least two years of experience teaching in early childhood education and TK-12 education, to serve a three-year term that begins August 1, 2022 and ends July 31, 2025.


