Dear Council President Fortunato Bas and Members of the City Council:

Pursuant to Section 401 of the Charter, the City Attorney has prepared and requests your approval of a resolution authorizing compromise and settlement of the above-entitled cases based on Defendants' agreement to waive litigation costs to which they are entitled as prevailing parties in exchange for the City's agreement to terminate the litigation.

The City of Oakland filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court ("District Court") against the National Football League ("NFL") and Thirty-Two NFL clubs related to the Raiders' move from Oakland to Las Vegas. The lawsuit alleged, among other things: (1) violations of the federal antitrust laws and (2) breach of contract.

The District Court granted Defendants' motion to dismiss the antitrust claim and dismissed the breach of contract claim for lack of federal court jurisdiction, leaving open the possibility of refiling the contract claim in state court.

The City appealed the dismissal of the antitrust claim to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ("Ninth Circuit"). The Ninth Circuit affirmed the District Court's order dismissing the City's case and the City sought review in the United States Supreme Court. In October 2022, the Supreme Court denied review of the City's antitrust claim.

After the District Court dismissed the City's breach of contract claims, the City filed a new lawsuit in Los Angeles County Superior Court. After the state court granted the Defendants' motion to dismiss, the City filed an appeal. The Court of Appeal affirmed the Superior Court's order and dismissed the case.

The City has determined that it is in the City's best interest to end the litigation in exchange for Defendants' agreement to waive litigation costs to which they are entitled as prevailing parties.

The Council authorized settlement of this case in closed session on Thursday, October 20, 2022 (moved by Vice Mayor Rebecca Kaplan and seconded by Councilmember Loren Taylor - 8 Ayes).
