WHEREAS, the City Clerk has canvassed the election returns of said General Municipal Election pursuant to law; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has certified the results for the General Municipal Election attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, California Elections Code sections 10263 and 15400 provide that the governing body shall declare the results of each election under its jurisdiction as to the persons elected and the measures voted on at the election; now, therefore, be it

the first 10 years after issuance of the certificate of occupancy; (3) remove failure to sign a new lease as grounds for eviction; and (4) make other clarifying amendments

Measure to improve public safety and invest in Oakland by creating affordable housing for Oaklanders, increasing housing for homeless Oaklanders, repaving streets to remove potholes, improving traffic/pedestrian safety, and updating fire stations and other public facilities, by issuing \$850,000,000 in general obligation bonds, raising approximately \$85,000,000 annually while bonds are outstanding at the rate of \$0.071 per \$100 (\$71 per \$100,000) of assessed value, with independent oversight and annual audits
