RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Receive An Informational Report To Begin Discussing Mayor And Council Priorities For The Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-2025 Budget Based On Preliminary Projected Increases Or Decreases In The Next Budget In Accordance With The Consolidated Fiscal Policy (Ordinance 13487 C.M.S.)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Pursuant to the adoption of the Consolidated Fiscal Policy (“CFP”) Ordinance No. 13487 C.M.S., the City Administrator is required to brief the City Council on estimated baseline expenditures, revenue projections and provide an overview of the City's budgeting process at its biennial workshop for discussing priorities. **Attachment A** contains the PowerPoint presentation providing this briefing.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

On December 14, 2014, the City Council adopted the CFP (Ordinance No 13279 C.M.S.). The CFP was amended on May 15, 2018, by the City Council (Ordinance No. 13487 C.M.S.) as part of a regular review of the City's financial policies.

Section 3.1 of the CFP requires the Council to hold a workshop with an initial Budget Briefing and Priorities Discussion.

2. Council Initial Budget Briefing and Priorities Discussion

Requirements: The Mayor and City Council will hold a bi-annual budget workshop soon after the commencement of the Council term. The workshop will include briefings on estimated baseline expenditures, revenue projections and an overview of the City's budgeting process. The workshop will provide the Mayor and Council with the opportunity to begin discussing priorities for the next budget year based on the Assessment of Stakeholder Needs, Concerns and Priorities

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

Attachment A contains the PowerPoint presentation providing this briefing. In summary the City is facing a very substantial budget shortfall in its General Purpose Fund (GPF). This shortfall is larger than any others since the Late in 1970s.

The forecasts and projections underlying the estimated shortfall will be refined in the City's Five-Year Financial Forecast and presented to the City Council at its March 14th Finance and Management Committee Meeting.
