


This resolution would allocate \$18 million of Measure U funds for the construction of the Mandela Station Affordable housing development, in a mixed-use, mixed-income, transit-oriented development at the West Oakland BART station.



BART System Map






TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT

- Housing near jobs
- Increased ridership on public transit
- Reduced vehicle miles traveled/ related pollution impacts

ADVANCING RACIAL EQUITY

- Undoing the harms of redlining, economic disinvestment, and physical division from higher-resourced areas due to the construction of multiple freeways and BART tracks
- Creates a diverse, high-density community that provides housing and job opportunities for existing residents and does so in a context that respects West Oakland's rich history





MEASURE U

2022 Affordable Housing and Infrastructure Bond

- \$850 million general obligation bonds to invest in infrastructure projects
- \$350 million reserved for affordable housing projects
- Plan to fund the construction, acquisition, and rehabilitation of 2,200-2,400 affordable housing units over the next four to six years

MEASURE U ELIGBILITY

Address improvements to the City's existing core capital assets

Maintain or decrease the City's existing operations and maintenance costs

Address social and geographic equity and provide greater benefit to underserved populations and geographic areas of greatest need

WHY NOW?

Mandela Station Partners plan to apply for CDLAC/ TCAC funding. Committing Measure U funds prior to the CDLAC/ TCAC deadline in May 2023 will provide a competitive local match in their application.

As a further process is undertaken to identify additional projects to be funded with Measure U, this Resolution takes action to allocate a small fraction of Measure U funding, at this time, to allow a vital project in our pipeline to pursue leveraging outside funds, get underway, and to respond timely to the housing crisis.

*This allocation does not change the timing of the issuance of Measure U bonds.
