INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER KALB

ADOPT A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF SENATE BILL 466 (WAHAB), WHICH WOULD AMEND THE COSTA-HAWKINS RENTAL HOUSING ACT TO NEWLY ALLOW LOCAL JURISDICTIONS TO REGULATE THE RENTAL RATES FOR (1) DWELLING UNITS THAT HAVE BEEN ISSUED A CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY MORE THAN 15 YEARS PRIOR TO THE DATE ON WHICH THE OWNER SEEKS TO ESTABLISH A RENTAL RATE; AND (2) ALIENABLE SEPARATE DWELLING UNITS SUCH AS SINGLE-FAMILY DWELLINGS AND INDIVIDUAL SUBDIVIDED CONDOMINIUM DWELLING UNITS

WHEREAS, the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act, enacted in 1995, places limits on municipal rent control ordinances by prohibiting cities from establishing rent control over single-family dwelling units, condominiums, dwelling units issued a certificate of occupancy after February 1. 1995, and dwelling units that were exempt from rent control pursuant to a local ordinance prior to February 1, 1995; and

WHEREAS, the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act has kept cities like Oakland from being able to adequately protect our tenants for far too long; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland and the entire Bay Area are experiencing a severe housing crisis marked by high levels of homelessness and a lack of affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, according to PolicyLink, nearly half of rental households in Oakland are cost-burdened and 59% of households of color are cost-burdened¹; and

WHEREAS, existing law, the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act, prescribes statewide limits on the application of local rent control with regard to certain properties; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 466 would amend the Costa Hawkins Rental Housing Act to limit it's prohibition against rent control to dwelling units that have been issued a certificate of occupancy within the 15 years preceding the date on which the owner seeks to establish a rental

RESOLVED: That the City Council directs the City Administrator or his designee to immediately distribute this Resolution upon its adoption to Governor Gavin Newsom and State Senator Wahab.
