RESOLUTION AWARDING GRANTS TO FORTY (40) OAKLAND-BASED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS AND INDIVIDUAL ARTISTS PROVIDING ARTS AND CULTURAL SERVICES IN OAKLAND FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022-23 (ROUND TWO), IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000)

WHEREAS, in 1985, the City Council adopted the first arts funding policies and procedures for the City of Oakland (City), establishing a panel system of evaluating funding proposals and distributing City funds to the arts; and

WHEREAS, the Cultural Funding Program, housed in the Economic and Workforce Development Department, is the City's funding mechanism to support Oakland-based nonprofit organizations and artists providing arts and cultural activities to the public; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Cultural Funding Program is to fund Oakland-based art and cultural activities that reflect the diversity of the City for citizens of and visitors to Oakland, focusing on the key areas of General Support, Neighborhood Arts, and Arts Education, through four grant making categories for Individual Artist Projects, Organization Programs, Organizational Assistance, and Festivals; and

WHEREAS, the Cultural Funding Program awards two rounds of grant funding in FY 2022-23, including supporting individual artist projects in Oakland's neighborhoods and providing arts-focused program support to organizations during its second round of funding (Round Two); and

WHEREAS, in March 2023, the Cultural Funding Program convened review panels and forwarded recommendations to the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee (FAC) for commentary, and the FAC unanimously supported staff's recommendation to City Council that these Round Two grants for Fiscal Year 2022-23 Cultural Funding be awarded in the amounts listed in the below table; and

WHEREAS, Fiscal Year 2022-23 funds for the Cultural Funding Program are available as follows: \$550,000 in General Purpose Fund (1010), Cultural Arts & Marketing Org (85511), Cultural Arts Grant Fund Project (1000166); \$50,000 from the Transient Occupancy Tax surcharge, which will be reserved for arts grants in the Measure C: Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Surcharge Fund (2419), Cultural Arts & Marketing Org (85511), TOT Surcharge: Cultural Grants Project (1000458); and

WHEREAS, staff recommends that the City Council award grants to specific individual artists and nonprofit organizations, as set forth in the below table:
