A motion was made by Councilmember Kalb, seconded by Councilmember Fife to approve the ordinance as amended and to be forwarded with committee recommendations to the April 18, 2023 City Council Agenda On Non Consent. The motion passed with 4 Ayes. The ordinance was approved to be forwarded as amended with the following amendments:

Of the Legislation, On page 1 of the Title, striking the (5) Limit Evictions Of Resident Managers With Pre Existing Tenancies; And (6) And (5)

On Page 4, adding four Whereas Clauses to read:

WHEREAS, continued advocacy of County, State and Federal government partners is necessary to secure additional resources to address the economic and housing impacts of COVID-19 on tenants and property owners; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the Just Cause for Eviction Ordinance is consistent with Civil Code Section 1946.2 as (enacted by the Tenant Protection Act of 2019), and, in comparison to Civil Code Section 1946.2, further limits the reasons for termination of residential tenancy, provides additional tenant protections, and, in conjunction with other City ordinances, provides for higher relocation assistance amounts; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the Just Cause for Eviction Ordinance as amended herein is more protective than the provisions of Civil Code Section 1946.2; and

WHEREAS, this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to sections of the CEQA Guidelines, taken together and each as a separate and independent basis, including but not limited to: Section 15378 (regulatory actions), Section 15060(c)(2) (no direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment), Section 15061(b)(3) (no significant environmental impact), and Section 15183 (consistent with the general plan or zoning); and

On Page 7, Section 8.22.360- Good cause required for eviction, Paragraph 2, adding, To establish a substantial violation of a material term of the tenancy, and or other tenants,

On Page 8, adding paragraph (d.) to read, For purposes of this section, failure to comply with income recertification requirements for deed-restricted affordable housing units shall be presumed to substantially violate a material term of the tenancy.

On Page 14, striking paragraph 9, and changing the 10th paragraph to read 9.

On Page 15, Section 9., adding the last sentence to read, City Council also directs the City Administrator to seek additional financial resources to address the economic and housing impacts of COVID-19 on tenants and property

owners.

On Page 16, adding Section 12. Directions to Rent Board. The City Council directs the City Administrator to work with the Rent Board to revise the Just Cause for Eviction Ordinance Regulations to implement newly added Just Cause provisions including, but not limited to, establishing further guidance on what constitutes "substantial actual damage" pursuant to O.M.C. 8.22.360A2.
