RE: Resolution of Intention To Levy An Annual Assessment For Fiscal Year 2012/13 For The Montclair Business Improvement District, Approving The Annual Report Of The Montclair Business Improvement District Advisory Board, And Scheduling A Public Hearing For December 6, 2011

SUMMARY

Pursuant to Streets and Highways Code Section 36500 *et seq.* and the City of Oakland's Neighborhood Business Improvement District Program a Resolution of Intention has been prepared to authorize the levy of an annual assessment for the Montclair Business Improvement District (BID) for the upcoming 2012/13 fiscal year, approving the annual report for the Montclair BID and scheduling a public hearing for December 6, 2011.

State law requires that business-based BIDs receive City Council's approval before levying each fiscal year's assessment. Therefore, to enable the Montclair BID to collect its FY 2012/13 assessment City Council would need to adopt the attached Resolution of Intention to levy and to schedule a related public hearing. The public hearing must take place no less than 10 days and no more than 30 days after the adoption of the attached Resolution of Intention. Following the public input portion of the hearing, the City Council would then take final action regarding the proposed levy.

FISCAL IMPACTS

No fiscal impact is anticipated to the City. The Montclair BID (MBID) is a self-funded, selfadministered entity. The MBID will pay all of its own operating costs and will be cost neutral to the City budget. If the levy is approved, the City of Oakland Finance and Management Agency (FMA) will conduct a special billing to collect the assessment and will remit the amount collected (minus the City's costs of collection) to a designated non-profit BID administrator.

Until disbursed, MBID assessments will be held in a special trust fund established by FMA on behalf of the district in Miscellaneous Trusts Fund (7999)/NCR & SDS Org (88569)/Pass Thru Assessments Account (24224)/Undetermined Project (0000000)/Montclair BID Program (MBID).

BACKGROUND

On November 9, 1999, the City Council approved Resolution No. 75323 C.M.S. which initiated a City of Oakland Neighborhood Business Improvement District (NBID) Program. This program is authorized by Section 36500 of the California Streets and Highway Code which allows for the establishment of local business improvement districts throughout the state. Pursuant to the above legislation Ordinance No. 12378 C.M.S. was passed by City Council November 27, 2001 to establish the Montclair BID.

The BID model for economic development is also being successfully employed in the Rockridge (established 2000), Fruitvale (established 2001, renewed in 2006 and 2011), Lakeshore/Lake Park (established 2002), Temescal (established 2004), Laurel (established 2005), Koreatown/Northgate (established 2007), Lake Merritt/Uptown (established 2008), and the Downtown Oakland (established 2008) districts and in other commercial neighborhoods throughout the country.

BIDs seek to create a stable cash flow and incorporate all of the members of a business community into a productive and proactive entity representing the interests of that community. Revenues generated by BIDs are used to provide a variety of special benefit improvements and services beyond those already provided by the local municipality. Examples of BID-funded services include, but are not limited to, enhanced maintenance services, safety and security, marketing and promotions, and special events. Enhanced services of this type are intended to support increased sales and business tax revenues as well as increased job opportunities and to improve the vitality of affected commercial neighborhoods.

KEY ISSUES AND IMPACTS

There is no anticipated adverse impact associated with the authorization to levy FY 2012/13 assessments for the Montclair BID.

In terms of positive impacts, authorizing the continued collection of assessments for the district will provide the Montclair BID an on-going funding source for enhanced safety and security, beautified physical appearance, and organized economic development and marketing activities within the district. These special benefit services are intended to improve the conditions and image of the affected BID and to support on-going economic revitalization within the district. Reauthorization of the levy will also enable the Montclair BID to continue serving as an effective self-help model for other Oakland business districts.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Montclair BID encompasses approximately 218 businesses located in and around the Montclair commercial area and estimates an upcoming annual budget of approximately \$90,860 of which \$71,250 represents projected assessments to be collected in FY 2012/13.

If Council approves the FY 2012/13 levy for the Montclair BID, assessments will be levied in accordance with the district management plan on file with the Office of the City Clerk and the attached Annual Report (*Exhibit* A to the Resolution of Intention) submitted by the Montclair Village Association, the district's City Council appointed advisory board. The annual report and district management plan set forth actions that will serve to attract business and improve the commercial climate within the district. Key aspects of these documents include, but are not limited to, enhanced cleaning including sidewalk cleaning and power washing; enhanced public safety including private security services; beautified physical appearance including the installation and maintenance of decorative planters; special events such as the Pacific Fine Arts Festival, Annual Holiday Stroll, Village Restaurant Walk, Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween Parade, Family Fun Festival and farmers' markets; and special marketing activities such as production and distribution of a district e-newsletter and business directory, maintenance of a district website, and design and installation of wayfinding maps as provided for in *Exhibit A* to the attached Resolution of Intention.

The annual report indicates no changes in the boundaries of the business improvement district or in any benefit zones in the area. There is also no change in the original method and basis of levying the assessment.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The proposed levy will fund activities which are intended to support the eventual increase of property, sales, and business tax revenues as well as increased job opportunities and economic development of the Montclair commercial district.

Environmental: The proposed levy will enable the Montclair BID to continue its efforts to strengthen and beautify the physical image of the affected commercial neighborhood through the delivery of special benefits such as enhanced sidewalk cleaning, installation and maintenance of attractive new banners and directional signage and holiday decorations intended to uplift and unify the district's appearance.

Social Equity: BIDs incorporate all members of a business community into a productive and proactive entity representing the interests of that community. Administration of the cash flow generated by the district itself contributes to local merchant self-empowerment and provides enhanced services for the overall physical and economic betterment of the district.

DISABILITY AND SENIOR ACCESS

The reauthorization of assessments for the district has no direct implications for disability and senior access. However, improved public safety and security provided by the BID could serve to make the area safer and more accessible to all visitors, including senior citizens and disabled persons.

RECOMMENDATION(S) AND RATIONALE

Adoption of the attached Resolution of Intention will support confinued delivery of special benefit services within the Montclair BID as outlined in the district's Annual Report (*Exhibit A* to the attached Resolution of Intention). Such business improvement districts represent a proacfive effort on the part of neighborhood business owners to improve the maintenance and image of their district which, in turn, supports its on-going economic development.

Additionally, because BIDs are self-initiated, self-funded, and self-administered entities, there are no anticipated fiscal impacts for the City associated with continuance of the Montclair BID. Consequently, the Montclair BID should be viewed as a positive self-help model for other neighborhood commercial areas. Accordingly, staff recommends that the City Council adopt the Resolution of Intention to levy an annual assessment for fiscal year 2012/13 for the Montclair Business Improvement District, approving the annual report for the Montclair Business Improvement District and scheduling a public hearing for December 6, 2011, during which City Council must take final action regarding the proposed levy.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

The action requested of the City Council is to adopt the Resolution of Intention to levy an annual assessment for fiscal year 2012/13 for the Montclair Business Improvement District, approving the annual report of the Montclair Business Improvement District Advisory Board, and scheduling a public hearing for December 6, 2011.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO LEVY AN ANNUAL ASSESSMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012/13 FOR THE MONTCLAIR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, APPROVING THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTCLAIR BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD, AND SCHEDULING A PUBLIC HEARING FOR **DECEMBER 6, 2011**

WHEREAS, the State of California allows for the formation of business assessment districts under Street and Highways Code Section 36500 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the business license holders in the Montclair business district petitioned to form the Montclair Business Improvement District ("District") under said legislation to undertake the Management Plan for the District ("Plan") which is on file with the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Plan provides for new security, beautification, and economic development and marketing activities with the intent of creating a positive atmosphere in the District area (as more specifically identified in the Plan); and

WHEREAS, the Montclair Business Improvement District was established by the City Council on November 27, 2001, pursuant to Ordinance Number 12378; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Streets and Highways Code Section 36533, the Annual Assessment Report (attached as Exhibit A) ("Report") has been prepared by the Montclair Business Improvement District Advisory Board and filed with the City Clerk:

WHEREAS, state law requires that before the annual assessment for the Montclair Business Improvement District is levied, the City Council must: (1) approve the Report, (2) approve a Resolution of Intention that declares the City's intention to collect the assessments, and (3) schedule a public hearing to be held on the levy of the proposed assessment; and

WHEREAS, if the District assessments are approved and levied, they will be held (until disbursed) in a special trust fund established by the Finance and Management Agency on behalf of the District in Miscellaneous Trusts Fund (7999)/NCR & SDS Org (88569)/Pass Thru Assessments Account (24224)/Undetermined Project (0000000)/Montclair BID Program (MBID); now therefore be it

RESOLVED: that the Council of the City of **O**akland does find and determine as follows: 877765

- 1. The Montclair Business Improvement District was established in the Montclair area of the City of Oakland, California as a parking and business improvement area pursuant to Street and Highways Code section 36500 ef seq with the boundaries as specified in the Plan on file with the City Clerk.
- 2. The Annual Assessment Report for the District is hereby approved, and pursuant to Streets and Highways Code Section 36534, the City Council declares its intention to levy and collect the assessments for the 2012/13 fiscal year as provided for in the Annual Assessment Report and pursuant to the assessment formula as provided for in the Plan, if the requested assessments are approved by the City Council after the Public Hearing scheduled by this Resolution of Intention.
- 3. The boundaries of the District shall remain the same as specified in the Plan on file with the City Clerk and there are no changes to the boundaries or benefit zones.
- 4. The types of the improvements and activities proposed to be funded by the levy of assessments on businesses in the area are those specified above in this Resolution and more specifically as described in the Plan and the Annual Assessment Report on file with the City Clerk. No substantial changes in the improvements or activities for the District are proposed to be made. Please refer to the Plan and Report on file with the City Cierk for a full and detailed description of the improvements and activities to be provided for the 2012/13 fiscal year, the boundaries of the area and any benefit zones within the area, and the proposed assessments to be levied upon the businesses within the area for the 2012/13 fiscal year.
- 5. The proposed method and basis of levying the assessments to be levied against each business in the District are those specified in the Plan and Annual Assessment Report on file with the City Clerk.
- 6. A Public Hearing is set for December 6, 2011, to hear all public comments, protests, and take final action as to the levying of the proposed assessments for the District for the fiscal year 2012/13.
- 7. The City Clerk is directed to give notice of the Public Hearing by causing the Resolution of Intention to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Oakland for not less than seven days before the Public Hearing.
- 8. At the Public Hearing the testimony of all interested persons for or against the proposed assessments will be heard and written and oral protests may be made. The form and manner of protests shall comply with Sections 36524 and 36525 of the Streets and Highways Code.
- 9. A protest may be made orally or in writing by any interested person. Any protest pertaining to the regularity or sufficiency of the proceedings shall be in writing and shall clearly set forth the irregularity or defect to which the objection is made.
- 10. Every written protest shall be filed with the clerk at or before the time fixed for the public hearing. A written protest may be withdrawn in writing at any time before the conclusion of the public hearing.

- 11. Each written protest shall contain a description of the business in which the person subscribing the protest is interested sufficient to identify the business and, if a person subscribing is not shown on the official records of the City as the owner of the business, the protest shall contain or be accompanied by written evidence that the person subscribing is the owner of the business.
- 12. A written protest which does not comply with the requirements stated above shall not be counted in determining a majority protest.
- 13. If written protests are received by the owners of businesses in the proposed area which will pay 50 percent or more of the assessments proposed to be levied and protests are not withdrawn so as to reduce the protests to less than that 50 percent, the proposed assessment shall not be levied.
