RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT OF ALEXANDRIA (DRIA) FEARNTO THE BUDGET ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Section 601 of the City Charter provides that members of City boards and commissions shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Mayor Jean Quan has appointed Alexandria (Dria) Fearn on the recommendation of the Chair of the Community and Economic Development Committee to serve a two year term on this committee subject to confirmation by the City Council; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to City Charter section 601, the City Council hereby confirms the Mayor's appointment of Alexandria (Dria) Fearn to a two-year

term on the Budget Advisory Committee beginning May 25, 2010 and ending May 24, 2012 to a seat previously held by Richard Zavala.
