RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the Alameda County – Oakland Community Action Partnership (AC-OCAP) Annual Report And a Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator To 1) Accept, Appropriate, And Allocate A Renewal Grant In An Anticipated Amount Of \$1,281,473 In Anti-Poverty Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Funds For Calendar Year 2013 From The State Of Califomia Department Of Community Services And Development (CSD) For Oakland and the Surrounding Alameda County (Excluding Berkeley); 2) Accept Any Additional CSBG Funding that May Become Available For Existing Programming Without Returning To Council; and 3) Negotiate, Execute, Extend and Amend 2012 and 2013 Grant Agreements/Contracts With Service Providers In Alignment With The City's 2012-2013 State Approved Community Action Plan.

REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL

At the December 11, 2012 Life Enrichment Committee meeting, staff was requested to return to the December 18, 2012 City Council meeting with the following supplemental information 1) the current roster of the Alameda County- Oakland Community Action Partnership Administering Board, which is provided as *Attachment A*; and 2) an overview of the Administering Board membership process.

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AC-OCAP's Administering Board composition is mandated by Federal Public Law 105-285, SEC. 676B which states that a public "entity shall administer the Community Services Block Grant program through a *tripartite board* that fully participates in the development, planning, implementation, and evaluation of the program(s) to serve low-income communities". Under AC-OCAP's revised October 18, 2011 City Council and State approved bylaws, Article IV Administering Board Membership, the newly expanded 18 member Administering Board is comprised of one-third community members who are democratically elected/selected through an application and petition process for a total of nine (9) members, six (6) elected officials or their designees, and three (3) members who represent other groups and interests that serve the low-income community. Board members of the Alameda County – Oakland Community Action Partnership Administering Board serve a three-year staggered term.
