RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approve a Resolution authorizing the City Administrator, or Her Designee, to reject all bids received for the construction of the Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit, to waive further competitive bidding, and to negotiate with bidders to award a contract for the construction of the Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit in an amount up to one-hundred and ninety-six thousand dollars (\$196,000.00) without returning to Council.

OUTCOME

The Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit (Parking Lot Retrofit) was chosen to meet the Supplementary Environmental Project (SEP) requirements of an Administrative Civil Liability imposed on the City of Oakland by the Regional Water Quality Control Board for sanitary sewer overflow violations. In addition to meeting Administrative Civil Liability obligations, the Parking Lot Retrofit will serve as a demonstration of how to utilize green infrastructure elements, including permeable pavers and biofiltration, to treat stormwater for pollutant removal and volume reduction. Implementation of the Parking Lot Retrofit will also help the City meet its National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit requiring infiltration, detention, and treatment of stormwater runoff. The work is located in Council District 3 as shown in *Attachment A*.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

In 2010 the City of Oakland was issued an Administrative Civil Liability violation by the Regional Water Quality Control Board (Water Board) for sanitary sewer overflow discharges. As a result the City was required to pay a fine to the State Water Board Cleanup and Abatement Account and to complete a Supplementary Environmental Project (SEP). The City proposed and the Water Board accepted the Oakland Firehouse Biotreatment Retrofit Project as the SEP. The project goals include improving water quality and implementing new biotreatment technology.

While the project meets the requirements of the SEP, it also helps the City meet its NPDES, municipal stormwater discharge permit that requires cities to develop strategies to infiltrate, detain, and treat stormwater runoff It also repairs a severely damaged and degraded city parking lot and associated infrastructure.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

On April 4, 2013, the City Clerk received three bids for this project, as shown below. All bidders met and/or exceeded the minimum 50% Local Business Enterprise and Small Local Business Enterprise (L/SLBE) participation requirement as show in *Attachment* B. All bids, however, were deemed non-responsive for exceeding the engineer's estimate by more than ten percent and for failing to list all required suppliers and subcontractors. Additionally, a bid protest was filed by Beliveau Engineering against Bay Construction for the failure to demonstrate that they are using a supplier with the required paver installation certification per bid specifications.

The Engineer's estimate for the work is \$178,800.50.

Staff proposes that Council reject all bids and authorize the City Administrator or Her Designee to negotiate with the bidders to award a construction contract for the Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit Project in an amount up to \$196,000.00. Some re-scoping of the bid may be required to bring the project within budget.

Oakland Municipal Code, Titie 2, Section 2.04.050.1 (2) and (5) allows waiver of competitive bidding when bidding would be in the best interests of the City.

The timeline for the SEP requires that the project be constructed by the end of fall 2013. In order to meet this deadline, it is important to expedite the award of a construction contract. Staff believes that rejecting all bids and authorizing the City Administrator or Her Designee to negotiate with the bidders to award a contract will allow the project to meet this timeline and remain cost effective.

The contractor who is awarded the construction contract will be required to fully meet the City's Local/Small Local Business Enterprise and local trucking programs.

PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST

Staff will provide advance notification to the property owners in the construction site area. The construction is located on City property utilized exclusively by Oakland Fire Department and Office of Emergency Services personnel. The project includes an educational sign that will be viewable by the public to describe the project components and benefits.

COORDINATION

Watershed and Stormwater Management staff within the Department of Engineering and Construction has coordinated with Oakland Fire Department Fire Station One, Public Works Storm Drain Operations, Right of Way Management, Traffic Engineering, and Tree Services staff during the design and planning of the parking lot retrofit.

Award of this contract will allow the City to comply with requirements of the Administration Civil Liability imposed by the Water Board. The ongoing maintenance of the project elements will be conducted by staff of Oakland Fire Station One.

PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

Previous work by all three contractors has been satisfactory. The Contractor Performance Evaluations for Bay Construction, Beliveau Engineering, and Ray's Electric are included in the Compliance Analysis, *Attachment B*.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The contractor will have 50% of the work hours performed by Oakland residents and 50% of all new hires are to be Oakland residents, which will result in monies being spent locally.

Environmental: Installing the biotreatment retrofit project will improve water quality in Oakland and the San Francisco Bay by preventing pollutants from entering the stormwater system and flowing into San Francisco Bay.

Social Equity: The biotreatment retrofit project will serve as a model and demonstration for future biotreatment retrofit projects throughout Oakland. Urban greening projects such as biotreatment retrofit projects have been shown to result in will result in a healthier, cleaner, and more attractive environments.



Comments: Ray's Electric exceeded the Local Employment Program's 50% resident hiring goal with 100% resident employment and met the 15% Oakland Apprenticeship Program goals with 587.5 on-site hours and 587.5 off-site hours.

Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator Or Her Designee To Reject All Bids Received For The Construction Of The Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit, To Waive Further Competitive Bidding, And To Negotiate With The Bidders To Award A Contract For The Construction Of The Fire Station One Parking Lot Biotreatment Retrofit (Project No. C329126) In An Amount Up To One Hundred Ninety-Six Thousand Dollars (\$196,000.00)

WHEREAS, in 2010 the City of Oakland was issued an Administrative Civil Liability violation by the Regional Water Quality Control Board for sanitary sewer overflow discharges; and

WHEREAS, as a result the City was required to pay a fine to the State Water Board Cleanup and Abatement Account and to complete a Supplementary Environmental Project (SEP); and

WHEREAS, the City proposed as an SEP the Oakland Fire Station One Biotreatment Retrofit Project (Parking Lot Retrofit) with the goals of improving water quality and implementing new biotreatment retrofit technology; and

WHEREAS, the Water Board accepted this project as appropriate for meeting the guidelines of the SEP; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2013, three bids were received by the Office of the City Clerk of the City of Oakland for the Parking Lot Retrofit, Project No. C329126; and

WHEREAS, bid proposals were received from Bay Construction, Beliveau Engineering, and Ray's Electric; and

WHEREAS, all three bid proposals were deemed non-responsive for exceeding the engineer's estimate of \$178,800.50 by more than ten percent and additionally for failing to list all required suppliers and subcontractors; and

WHEREAS, waiving further advertising and bidding and authorizing the City Administrator or Her Designee to negotiate with the bidders to award a contract will allow the project to stay cost-effective and to meet the SEP deadline; and

WHEREAS, the City's Municipal Code, Title 2, Section 2.04.050.1 (2) and (5) allows waiver of competitive bidding when bidding would be unavailing or it is in the best interests of the City to waive bidding; and

WHEREAS, the contractor will be required to meet the requirements of the City's L/SLBE, the Local Trucking, Local Employment and Apprenticeship Programs; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds in the project budget for the work in the following project account:

• Fund (3100); Watershed Organization (92245); Storm Drainage Construction Account (57414); Project No. C329126: \$196,000.00 and these funds were specifically allocated for this project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the City lacks the equipment and qualified personnel to perform the necessary work, and that the performance of this contract is in the best public interest because of economy or better performance and that this contract is of a professional, scientific, or technical nature; and

WHEREAS, completion of this project will also help the City meet its National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit that requires cities to develop strategies to infiltrate, detain, and treat stormwater runoff; and

WHEREAS, the City Administrator has determined that the performance of this contract shall not result in the loss of employment or salary by any person having permanent status in the competitive services; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That pursuant to Oakland Municipal Code Section 2.04.050.L5 and based on the reasons stated herein and in the City Administrator's report accompanying this resolution, the City Council hereby finds and determines that it is in the City's best interests to waiver further advertising and bidding for the construction contract for the Parking Lot Retrofit (Project No. C329126) and so waives the requirements; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That all bids are hereby rejected; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or Her Designee is hereby authorized to negotiate with the bidders and award a construction contract for the Parking Lot Retrofit (Project No. C329126) in an amount up to one hundred ninety-six thousand dollars (\$196,000.00) without returning to Council; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the contractor selected will be required to meet the City's local business and employment program and other contracting requirements; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator, or Her designee, is authorized, on behalf of the City of Oakland, to negotiate, apply for, accept, submit, and execute all documents, including, but not limbed to, applications, contracts, amendments, payment requests, and related actions for the completion of these projects; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council hereby approves the plans and specifications for the Parking Lot Retrofit; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the amount of the bond for faithful performance, equal to the amount of the contract, and the amount for a bond to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and material furnished, and for the amount due under the Unemployment Insurance Act, equal to the amount of the contract with respect to such work are hereby approved; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council finds that the City lacks the equipment and qualified personnel to perform the necessary work, that the performance of this contract is in the public interest because of economy or better performance, and that this contract is of a professional, scientific, or technical nature; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the contract shall be reviewed and approved by the City Attorney for form and legality and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
