RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the proposed ordinance authorizing a 2.7 percent increase for FY 2013-14, consistent with the Consumer Price Index (CPI), in the tax imposed pursuant to the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997.

OUTCOME

Adjustment of the FY 2013-14 special parcel tax for the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997, consistent with the Consumer Price Index.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

In June 1997, the electorate of Oakland approved, by more than a two-thirds majority, the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997 (Measure M). Measure M imposed a parcel tax for the purpose of raising revenue necessary to retain and enhance emergency dispatch and medical services in the City of Oakland, and replaced funding from a previous assessment imposed by the City that was invalidated by Proposition 218. The Measure M legislation authorizes the City Council to increase the tax rates by a cost-of-living factor beginning in Fiscal Year 1998-99 and continuing each fiscal year thereafter. A 2.7 percent increase for the Measure M special parcel tax rate is proposed for FY 2013-14, consistent with the Consumer Price Index increase for the San Francisco Bay Area during calendar year 2012. At no time, however, may the rates be increased by more than 5.0 percent of the tax rates imposed by ordinance during the immediate preceding fiscal year.

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The following table summarizes the historical tax rate increases that have been authorized pursuant to City Council action since the legislation was enacted.

ANALYSIS

The proposed ordinance applies an increase of 2.7 percent to the current Measure M special parcel tax amount, effective July 1, 2013. This increase is per the actual change in the San Francisco Bay Area CPI during calendar year 2012. The proposed increase applies on a fiscal year basis (i.e., July 1st – June 30th).

Note: The Consumer Price Index - All Urban Consumers is based on the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose, CA index

A public hearing on the proposed ordinance to increase the Measure M special parcel tax is scheduled for June 4, 2013 at 6:30 p.m.

COORDINATION

The report was prepared in coordination with the City Attomey's Office, Controller's Office, and Francisco & Associates, the City's Contractor, who annually administers special financing districts on behalf of the City.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

The FY 2013-14 estimated revenue from Measure M is approximately \$1,869,964, including the proposed rate increase. The proposed annual rate increase of 2.7 percent translates to \$49,162 of the total FY 2013-14 estimated revenue.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: Revenues generated from the Measure M special tax is relied upon to fund essential City services.

Environmental: There are no direct environmental impacts associated with the City Council action requested in this report.

Social Equity: There are no direct social impacts associated with the City Council action requested in this report.

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ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A FISCAL YEAR 2013-14 INCREASE TO A SPECIAL TAX IMPOSED FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX, AND PURSUANT TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RETENTION ACT OF 1997 (MEASURE M)

WHEREAS, in 1997 the voters of Oakland approved Measure M, a special tax to fund emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, Measure M imposed a special tax on all parcels in the City of Oakland, except where the parcels are otherwise exempt from taxation by Section 3 of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Measure M provided that beginning in fiscal year 1998-99 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Oakland City Council may increase the tax only upon a finding that the cost of living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area, as shown by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all items, has increased since the 1997 index year; and

WHEREAS, Measure M provided that any tax rate adjustment imposed by the City Council pursuant to the ordinance shall not exceed five percent of the tax rate imposed during the immediately preceding fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this ordinance to increase the Measure M special parcel tax was held on June 4, 2013 at 6:30 p.m. in City Hall, One Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland, California; now, therefore,

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Oakland City Council hereby finds that the Consumer Price Index for all items in the San Francisco Bay Area was 233.39 for calendar year 2011 and 239.65 for calendar year 2012.

- 2. The cost-of-living in the immediate San Francisco Bay Area as shown by the Consumer Price Index, has increased 2.7 percent from calendar year 2011 and calendar year 2012.
- 3. The Measure M special tax rate upward adjustment shall be 2.7 percent, effective July 1, 2013.
- 4. The following rate structure will be imposed on parcels within the City of Oakland effective July 1, 2013 for FY 2013-14:

Ordinance Authorizing A Fiscal Year 2013-14 Increase To A Special Tax Imposed For Emergency Medical Services, In Accordance With The Consumer Price Index, And Pursuant To The Emergency Medical Services Retention Act Of 1997 (Measure M)

NOTICE AND DIGEST

This Ordinance authorizes an increase to a special tax imposed by the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997 (Measure M), which was submitted to the voters by Resolution No. 73311 C.M.S. and approved by the voters in June 1997. The Act allows rates to be adjusted for changes in the Consumer Price Index, in an amount not to exceed five percent (5%), as provided in Section 4 of the Resolution. The proposed changes are a total increase of 2.7 percent for FY 2013-14. Effective July 1, 2013, the Single Family Residential rate would increase from \$12.64 to \$12.98, the Multiple Unit Residential rate (2 to 4 units) would increase from \$25.27 to \$25.95, the Muhiple Unit Residential rate (5 or more units) would increase from \$63.18 to \$64.89, the Commercial rate would increase from \$25.27 to \$25.95, the Industrial rate would increase from \$50.54 to \$51.90, the Rural rate would increase from \$12.64 to \$12.98, and the Institutional rate would increase from \$12.64 to \$12.98.

REGARDING AN ORDINANCE TO INCREASE THE SPECIAL TAX FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX AND PURSUANT TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES RETENTION ACT OF 1997

On Tuesday, June 4, 2013, the City Council of Oakland, California will consider an ordinance authorizing an increase to the special parcel tax imposed for emergency medical services in accordance with the Emergency Medical Services Retention Act of 1997 (Measure M). The ordinance proposes an increase, effective July 1, 2013, of 2.7% consistent with the Consumer Price Index for the San Francisco Bay Area. The Public Hearing is set for Tuesday, June 4, 2013 at 6:30 p.m., to be held before the City Council in the Council Chambers located on the Third Floor of City Hall, One Frank H. Ogawa Plaza, Oakland, Caiifomia.
