A reduction of 19.37% in ESG and CDBG funding for the City would result serving only 1,613 households/year with estimated outcomes of approximately 784 homeless families housed.

A 22% reduction of funds could result in service levels decreased to 352 households living with HIV/AIDS.

Mathilda Clevelan Transitional Housi Program (MCTHP)	ng	\$264,765 (1.02% increase)	Funding for MCTHP actually increased by 1.02%. MCTHP serves 14-18 homeless families/year with transitional housing and services for up to 24 months. The funding increase will be applied to previously under-funded administration, maintaining services at current levels.		
Families In Transition (FIT)	\$245,420.00	\$249,815 (1.02% increase)	Funding for FIT actually increased by 1.02%. FIT serves 10-12 homeless families/year with transitional housing and services for up to 24 months.
