RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council accept this supplemental attachment to the Permanent Access To Housing (PATH) report: *Attachment D* was added to provide homeless population data as requested by the Life Enrichment Committee on June 25, 2013.

The attached data compare homeless populations in Alameda County over the last ten years, from 2003 to 2013. Where available, Oakland specific data have been included. Overall, the number of homeless households has decreased, with significant progress in Oakland for homeless families. Preliminary data indicate that there has been an increase in homeless single persons in Oakland, although the numbers county-wide have been essentially flat since 2011. Data from the 2013 homeless count are preliminary in nature, and are subject to final edits by EveryOne Home. Further data on specific sub-populations will be included in a follow up report per the request of Life Enrichment Committee members, including transition age youth, LGBT populations, sexually exploited minors, re-entry and realignment populations, and persons with special needs, including those with mental health, substance use, and other issues.

ATTACHMENT D: Longitudinal Data on Homeless Populations


Alameda County's literally homeless population has shifted in size and some characteristics of the population have changed over the last ten years. From 2003 – 2013, the big picture trends are promising:

- Homelessness decreased by over 800 people, a 16% reduction.
- Homelessness decreased from .35% to .27% of the Alameda County population, during a period in which the overall population increased by 8%.

Expressed as a line graph, the total homeless population has decreased from 4,838 in 2007 to 4,178 in 2011. Since 2011, the total homeless population has remained relatively flat at 4,264

Alameda County's Total Homeless Population Over Time





Expressed as percentages, Chronically Homeless Individuals (21.8%); Persons in Chronically Homeless Families (2.8%); Veterans (11.5%); Severely Mentally III (25.9%); Chronic Substance Abuse (20.2%); Persons with HIV/AIDS (2.2%); Domestic Violence (24.5%)

Sheltered versus Unsheltered

Reflecting the EveryOne Home/PATH Strategies, the number of sheltered homeless has decreased from 48% of the total homeless population in 2003 to 28% in 2013; while the number of persons placed in permanent supportive housing went from 29% in 2005 to 38% in 2013.



Unsheltered vs. Sheltered Homeless People, 2003 - 2013



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
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Homelessness in Alameda County, 2003 - 2013

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Oakland Only Comparison: 2009 to 2003

Relative to Alameda County, the City of Oakland, over time, has accounted for approximately 50% of the total homeless population. In addition to the literally homeless, there are a number of "hidden homeless" – persons who are doubled up in housing, couch surfing, or staying with family or friends. The number of "hidden homeless" increased by over 250% between 2003 and 2009.

Families with children comprise 1,352 persons (31%) while singles comprise 2,912 persons (68%).



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
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
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
