## COUNCIL DISTRICT: Citv-Wide

## RECOMMENDATION

At the October 15, 2013 City Council hearing on redistricting, the Council heard from approximately 20 public speakers, and approved a motion to forward redistricting maps \# 18, 21 and 22 for further review and public comment. At the hearing, councilmembers made specific recommendations to the City's redistricting consultant, Doug Johnson, to change these three maps further. Those revised redistricting maps and their demographics tables are attached to this report as Maps \# 23, 24 and 25 (Attachments A, B and C).

With their October $15^{\text {th }}$ motion, the Council chose to narrow its review to three redistricting maps, out of the more than 50 redistricting proposals which have been received from the public. The next public hearing will be on October 29th. Staff recommends that the City Council accept this supplemental report, hear public comment, and recommend a preferred redistricting map(s) for staff to prepare as an ordinance for first reading at the November $19^{\text {th }}$ City Council hearing.

## REASON FOR SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

For the October 15, 2013 City Council hearing, the City's Redistricting consultant, Doug Johnson of National Demographics Corporation, prepared Redistricting proposals Map \#21 and Map \#22. Map \#21 shows changes in downtown Oakland: moving the border between Districts 2 and 3 to $19^{\text {th }}$ Street (from the current border of $14^{\text {th }}$ Street). Map \#22 moves the residential section of the Adams Point neighborhood out of District 3, and puts it into District 2 (Grand Avenue stays in District 3). Both Maps \# 21 and 22 unite the Maxwell Park neighborhood into a single Council district, District 4.

Also on October $15^{\text {th }}$, Map \#18 was forwarded by the Council for further discussion at the October $29^{\text {th }}$ hearing. Map \#18 was presented in the October $8^{\text {th }}$ Agenda Report, and was created by the consultant to show Maxwell Park united into District 4.

Item:

On October $15^{\text {th }}$, Council gave direction to the consultant to prepare new maps that make minor adjustments to Maps \#18, 21 and 22. Those maps are Attachments A, B and C to this report.

## Map \#23 (Revision of Map 18) Attachment A

Map \#23 is a revision of Map \#18. It results in a plan deviation of $5.06 \%$.
Details of Map \#23 which w ere shown in Map \#18:

- Trestle Glen Road is unified into District 2
- Lakeshore Avenue and streets east of Lake Merritt moved from District 3 to District 2
- Keeps District 1/District 3 border at its current location, along MacArthur Blvd
- Fairfax/Melrose area moved to District 6
- District 1/District 4 border along Broadway Terrace and Skyline Blvd

Details of Map \#23 which were made at the request of Council at the October $15^{\text {th }}$ hearing, or to balance population:

- San Antonio neighborhood back into District 2, from District 5-1,143 people
- Fremont High School back into District 5, from District 6-2,216 people
- Bancroft/55th/Intemational/51st "triangle" back into District 6 (from District 5) - 2,031 people
- Census blocks between Harrison St /Oakland Ave back into District 1, from District 2 640 people
- Maxwell Park united in District 6 (moved from District 4 in Map \#18) - 4,949 people
- Fruitvale Elementary neighborhood, from Sausal Creek down to Bona Street, and east to Coolidge, Peralta Hacienda Park, and area south of Allendale between Brookdale and Lyon Ave and Meadow St, to District $4-$ - 4,883 people
- Between 1-880 and International Blvd, from Seminary to $50^{\text {th }}$ Avenue, move to District 5 from District $6--3,923$ people
- Between Bancroft and International, move from 51st Ave to 54th Ave from District 6 to District 5--791 people

Mapping details which came as a result of public request:

-     - Glenwood Road unification in Glenview (from District 2 into District 5) - 161 people


## Map \#24 (Revision of Map\# 21) Attachment B

Map \#24 is a revision of Map \#21. It results in a plan deviation of $4.85 \%$.

Item:

Details of Map \#24 which were shown in Map \#21, at the October 15 Council hearing:

- APEN request for District 2 to move north of 14 th Street, into downtown. Border of District 2 and 3 moves north to 19th St.
- The Lakeshore Avenue area, east of Lake Merritt, stays in District 3
- District 1/District 2 border is unchanged from existing border on Oakland Avenue.
- District 1/District 3 border is changed: District 3 moves north to MacArthur, west of Highway 24; between Highway 24 and Broadway, District I moves south to 1-580, unifying Mosswood; District 3 stays north of 1-580 to MacArthur east of Broadway to keep Richmond Blvd neighborhood together
- District 1/District 4 border follows the 1993 Council map border, along Broadway Terrace to Skyline Blvd.
- Maxwell Park is united in District 4
- Fairfax/Melrose moves from District 4 to District 6
- Trestle Glen Road is united in District 2
- Fremont High stays in District 5
- District 5 picks up the Melrose Elementary School attendance area south of International Blvd
- Fruitvale Elementary and the area immediately around it south of 1-580 moves from District 4 to District 5
- In Fruitvale, Police Beat 24 Y is united in District 4 and Beat 24 X is united in District 5
- An area southeast of Fruitvale Elementary, between Coolidge and Peralta Creek north of Bona St, moves from District 5 to District 4 to balance populations
- No changes to current District 7 boundaries

Details of Map \#24 which were made at the request of Council on October 15:

- Maxwell Park united in District 6 (4,949 people)
- Fairfax/Melrose and adjoining area just south of Allendale back into District 4
- Area south of Brookdale, west of $55^{\text {th }}$ Avenue, and north of Bancroft into District 4, from District 6-406 people. This is part of Fairfax/Melrose, is more compact, and balances District 4 and District 6 total population
- Peralta Hacienda Park and areas west of Peralta Creek south of School St back to District 5, from District 4-2,159 people

Mapping details which came as a result of public request:

- Glenwood Road unification in Glenview (from District 2 into District 5) - 161 people
- Downtown, bring District 2 north from $19^{\text {th }}$ Street to 20th St, east of Broadway (102 additional people, for a total change of 5,383 people from District 3 to District 2).

## Map \#25 (Revision of Map \#22) Attachment C

Map \#25 is a revision of Map \#22. It has a plan deviation of $3.92 \%$.
Details of Map \#25 which were shown in Map \#22, at the October 15 Council hearing:

- Most of Adams Point moves from District 3 to District 2, divided along Bay Place, Montecito Ave, Lenox Ave, Van Buren Ave, Staten Ave, and Grand Ave
- The Lakeshore area, east of Lake Merritt, stays in District 3
- District 1/District 2 border is unchanged from existing border
- District 1/District 3 border is changed: District 3 moves north to 40 th west of Hwy 24; between Hwy 24 and Broadway, District 1 moves south to 1-580, unifying Mosswood; District 3 stays north of 1-580 to MacArthur east of Broadway, to keep Richmond Blvd neighborhood together
- District 1/District 4 border follows the 1993 Council map border, along Broadway Terrace to Skyline
- District 5 expands west into District 2, picking up the area between 23rd Ave and 21st Ave between 12th St in the south and 27th St in the north
- Maxwell Park is united in District 4
- Fairfax/Melrose moves from District 4 to District 6
- Trestle Glen Road is united in District 2
- Fremont High stays in District 5
- District 5 picks up the Melrose Elementary School attendance area south of International Blvd
- In Fruitvale, Police Beat 24 Y is united in District 4 and Beat 24 X is united in District 5
- District 4 expands the area it includes around Fruitvale Elementary to extend west from Champion St to Fruitvale Ave, and, south between Coolidge Ave and Peralta Creek south to Hyde St
- No changes to current District 7 boundaries.

Mapping details which came as a result of public request:

- Glenwood Road unification in Glenview (from District 2 into District 5) - 161 people


## OUTCOME

Staff seeks direction from the City Council on how to proceed with the drawing of proposed new Council district boundaries. Staff recommend that the Council select a preferred redistricting map and direct Staff to return with an ordinance ready for first reading. The Council's preferred redistricting map could be: (1) one of the already-drawn redistricting plans; (2) a map that Council directs Staff to develop by combining parts of the already-drawn redistricting plans; or (3) an entirely new redistricting plan.

## CEQA

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) does not apply to the 2013 Council redistricting, because the redistricting ordinance is not a "project" under CEQA. Section 15378 (b)(5) of the CEQA Guidelines states that a "project" under CEQA: "does not include...organizational or administrative activities of governments that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment."
