


Expenditure Plan Overview

 Freeway delays increased by 23% in 2013

Projects That Benefit Your Area

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- AC Transit double the funding to increase/restore services
- AC Transit bus rapid transit projects: Grand Avenue/ MacArthur Boulevard and Telegraph Avenue/East 14th Street/ International Boulevard
- Affordable and accessible transit for seniors and people with disabilities
- Affordable student transit pass program and Safe Routes to Schools
- BART expansion and modernization at BART stations in Oakland
- Bay Trail and East Bay Greenway bicycle and pedestrian projects
- College Avenue/Broadway transit priority and targeted improvements along Broadway and Broadway Streetcar
- Commuter rail service enhancements (Capitol Corridor)

Projects That Benefit Your Area

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- Freight improvements: Outer Harbor Intermodal Terminal, 7th Street grade separation, Oakland Army Base transportation infrastructure improvements and truck routes serving the Port of Oakland
- Improvements on major commute corridors in Oakland
- I-880 Broadway/Jackson Street multimodal transportation improvements
- I-880 local access and safety improvements at 23rd Avenue/ 29th Avenue, 42nd Avenue/High Street and Oak Street interchanges
- I-880 northbound carpool/express lane from A Street to Hegenberger Road
- Investments in transit oriented development at Eastmont Transit Center, the Broadway Valdez Specific Plan area and other major transit centers
- Operating and maintenance funding for ferry services
