Now, that the settlement is almost finalized, the City is backing out of paying our permit fees which in email has been stated that the permit waiver would be honored. We will be out of 61k and still not sure what is missing, damaged or needs to be replaced from our home. With this amount we are not sure if we can even repair the house. We just want to go home, we have children that want to go home. Please let us know what steps to take. Our attorney advised us to contact you. Thank you for your e-mail. I will work on my end regarding the waiver of permits. Our offer of \$277K included the cost of the permits at an estimated cost of \$23K, which we will not deduct from the offer amount. I understand that your clients have been put out of their home and inconvenienced.
