SUBJECT: Repair of Stair Paths at Locarno Way

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Administrator to execute a construction contract with Mosto Construction to Repair Stair Paths at Locarno Way (Project No. C470710), in accordance with the project plans and specifications and with contractor's bid in the amount of One Hundred Eighty-Seven Thousand One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$187,110.00).

OUTCOME

Approval of this resolution will authorize the City Administrator to execute a construction contract with Mosto Construction, in the amount of \$187,110.00. The work to be completed under this project is part of the Citywide Path and Stair Repair Program. The work is located in Council District 1 as shown in Attachment A. Locarno Way connects the dead end of Alpine Terrace, descending 2 blocks to Cross Road.

This project will replace broken, slumped concrete steps and landings and add new handrails that comply with the Federal Americans with Disability Act (ADA) to both sides of the path.

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The Locarno Way Stair Path was built in the 1920's to facilitate faster pedestrian access within neighborhoods and to transit routes before the automobile era. There are approximately 220 developed path and stairs in the City of Oakland. Thirty-One of these paths and stairs require complete replacement, including Locarno Way. The City's Path and Stair Repair Program in consultation with two pedestrian-friendly community groups, Oakland Urban Paths (OUP) and Walk Oakland-Bike Oakland (WOBO) have prioritized Locarno Way for repairs. Repair of Locarno Way was prioritized as it is the most urgent hazard, given that the steps are broken, slumped and uneven.

Funds for this project were appropriated by City Council on May 21, 2013 and (Resolution No. 84371 C.M.S.). Funding is allocated from a Metropolitan Transportation Commission, Transportation Development Agency (MTC-TDA) grant, (fund 2162), designated for pedestrian projects that facilitate a walkable City. Renovated paths and stairs are used frequently by the local neighborhood and are very popular. Paths and stairs also provide secondary egress during emergencies. The City receives many requests for path and stair replacement or repairs. With our current funding, Oakland Public Works (OPW) is able to repair four to six paths and stairs per year.

This project was advertised on June 24, 2014. On July 17, 2014, the City Clerk received four bids for this project in the amount of \$187,114.00, \$188,613.00, \$196,453.00 and \$248,228.08. as shown in *Attachment B*. Mosto Construction was deemed the lowest responsive and responsible bidder and therefore is recommended for the award. The Engineer's estimate for the work is \$177,814.00. The proposed work consists, in general, of replacing broken concrete steps and landings, adding ADA compliant handrails on both sides of the path, and other related work as indicated on the plans and specifications.

ANALYSIS

The contract specifies \$1,000 in liquidated damages per calendar day if the contractor exceeds the contract completion time of 60 working days. Construction work is anticipated to begin in mid January 2015 and should be completed by the end of April 2015, contingent on weather conditions. The project schedule is shown in *Attachment B*.

Under the proposed contract with Mosto Construction, the Local Business Enterprise/Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) participation will be 89.50% and their local trucking participation will be 100%. The LBE/SLBE information has been verified by the Social Equity Division of the City Administrator's Office, Contracts and Compliance Division and is shown in *Attachment C.* Staff has reviewed the submitted bid for this work and has determined that the bid is reasonable for the current construction climate.

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

A notification letter will be sent to residents prior to start of construction. Staff has coordinated with both pedestrian-friendly public groups OUP and WOBO that construction of the recommended path and stair repairs will occur in 2015.

COORDINATION

The Office of the City Attorney and the Controller's Bureau has reviewed this report and resolution.

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COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

Approval of this resolution will allow the City Administrator to execute a construction contract with Mosto Construction in the amount of \$187,110.00.

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SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: This project replaces damaged and aged City infrastructure. Pedestrian paths promote walking. Walking trips tend to be local and thus are more likely to contribute to local economic activity. Path and stair repair contracts create job opportunities for local contractors.

Environmental: The contractor is required to deliver all concrete materials resulting from demolition to certified concrete recycling entities in accordance with the City Waste Recycling and Re-use Plan (WRRP). Walking replaces driving, contributing to the City's efforts to reduce air pollution and address climate change.

Social Equity: Path and stair repairs improve accessibility and safety for persons who depend on public transportation to access jobs, services, and recreational facilities.



City Administrator's Office, Contracts and Compliance Unit reviewed four (4) bids in response to the above referenced project. Below is the outcome of the compliance evaluation for the minimum 50% Local and Small Local Business Enterprise (L/SLBE) participation requirement, a preliminary review for compliance with the Equal Benefits Ordinance (EBO), and a brief overview of the lowest responsible bidder's compliance with the 50% Local Employment Program (LEP) and the 15% Oakland Apprenticeship Program on the bidder's most recently completed City of Oakland project.

*Mosto Construction and AJW Construction's proposed VSLBE/LPG participation value were 0.27% and 2.55%, however, per the L/SLBE Program a VSLBE/LPG's participation is double counted towards meeting the requirement. Therefore, the VSLBE/LPG values for Mosto Construction and AJW Construction are 0.54% and 5.10%.

The Supervising Civil Engineer will review the Contractor Performance Evaluation to ensure adequate documentation is included, the Resident Engineer has followed the process correctly, the Contractor Performance Evaluation has been prepared in a fair and unbiased manner, and the ratings assigned by the Resident Engineer are consistent with all other Resident Engineers using consistent performance expectations and similar rating scales.

The Resident Engineer will transmit a copy of the Contractor Performance Evaluation to the Contractor. Overall Ratings of Outstanding or Satisfactory are final and cannot be protested or appealed. If the Overall Rating is Marginal or Unsatisfactory, the Contractor will have 10 calendar days in which they may file a protest of the rating. The Public Works Agency Assistant Director, Design & Construction Services Department, will consider a Contractor's protest and render his/her determination of the validity of the Contractor's protest. If the Overall Rating is Marginal, the Assistant Director's determination will be final and not subject to further appeal. If the Overall Rating is Unsatisfactory and the protest is denied (in whole or in part) by the Assistant Director, the Contractor may appeal the Evaluation to the City Administrator, or his/her designee. The appeal must be filed within 14 calendar days of the Assistant Director's ruling on the protest. The City Administrator, or his/her designee, will hold a hearing with the Contractor within 21 calendar days of the filing of the appeal. The decision of the City Administrator regarding the appeal will be final.

Contractors who receive an Unsatisfactory Overall Rating (i.e., Total Score less than 1.0) will be allowed the option of voluntarily refraining from bidding on any City of Oakland projects within one year from the date of the Unsatisfactory Overall Rating, or of being categorized as non-responsible for any projects the Contractor bids on for a period of one year from the date of the Unsatisfactory Overall Rating. Two Unsatisfactory Overall Ratings within any five year period will result in the Contractor being categorized by the City Administrator as non-

responsible for any bids they submit for future City of Oakland projects within three years of the date of the last Unsatisfactory overall rating.



The Contractor is required to demonstrate improvements made in areas deemed Unsatisfactory in prior City of Oakland contracts.

The Public Works Agency Contract Administration Section will retain the final evaluation and any response from the Contractor for a period of five years. The City shall treat the evaluation as confidential, to the extent permitted by law.
