RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO COMPROMISE AND SETTLE THE CASE OF ANDRE TRAYLOR v. CITY OF OAKLAND, STEPHEN CHOI, ALAMEDA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT CASE NO. RG13-698346, IN THE AMOUNT OF EIGHTEEN-THOUSAND-SIX-HUNDRED-TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$18,625.00) AS A RESULT OF MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT ON OR ABOUT NOVEMBER 6, 2012 (OAKLAND POLICE DEPARTMENT – MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION)

WHEREAS, Andre Traylor was injured when the vehicle he was driving was rear-ended by a police patrol car driven by Officer Stephen Choi on Broadway in the City of Oakland on November 6, 2012, and

WHEREAS, Mr Traylor sustained injuries requiring medical treatment as a result of this accident; and

WHEREAS, Alameda County Superior Court Action RG13-698346 was filed against the City of Oakland and Officer Stephen Choi Bay alleging negligence, and

WHEREAS, In order to avoid the risk of an adverse jury verdict under the circumstances, now therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Attorney is authorized and directed to compromise and settle the case of <u>Andre Traylor v City of Oakland, Stephen Choi</u>, City Attorney's File No 29575, for the sum of Eighteen Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars and No Cents (\$18,625 00), and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Attorney is further authorized and directed to take whatever steps as may be necessary to effect said settlement, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the sum of Eighteen-Thousand-Six-Hundred-Twenty-Five Dollars and No Cents (\$18,625.00) be payable to Plaintiff Andre Traylor and his attorney Thomas H LemMon
