RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MAYOR JEAN QUAN FOR A LIFETIME OF DEDICATION AND ACHIEVEMENT IN MAKING GOVERNMENT WORK FOR THE PEOPLE AND FOR HER DEEP AND ABIDING LOVE FOR THE CITY OF OAKLAND

WHEREAS, Mayor Jean Quan is a woman of many firsts: She was the first woman and first Asian American to serve as Mayor of the City of Oakland, the first Asian American woman elected to the Oakland School Board and to the Oakland City Council, and the first Chinese American woman mayor of a major US City; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Jean Quan leveraged her many experiences on state and national policy councils in her 24 years as an elected official to provide an Oakland perspective on urban issues as well as to secure resources from foundations and the state and federal government to enhance the City's public safety, natural environment, resiliency and other efforts; and

WHEREAS, she built on her 12 years' experience as a school board member and national leader of urban school policy to link City services and programs to support the future of Oakland's students and youth through reestablishing the Oakland Education Cabinet, founding the Mayor's Mentoring Forum, launching Peace in the Parks, and by raising \$4.3 million to fund over 3,330 jobs for Oakland youth through the Mayor's Summer Jobs Program; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Jean Quan has ensured that City Government is more accessible to Oakland residents, by holding Town Hall meetings each year throughout the City, and opening up City hall for free financial counseling, mentorship programs, Volunteer for Oakland Day, support for local artists, technology training for small businesses and hundreds of community events to engage Oaklanders with their own city government. Mayor Jean Quan, with seemingly inexhaustible energy and stamina, frequently attends two and sometimes three community events a night to celebrate Oakland's "Can-Do" attitude; and

WHEREAS, while other cities have fallen into fiscal deficit, Mayor Jean Quan, working in collaboration with the City Council, created two balanced budgets. The City's finances are now in much better condition than they were during the difficult recessionary years, and with major revenues rising; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that Oakland continues to prosper, Mayor Jean Quan played a pivotal role in developing an agreement for Brooklyn Basin, a development that represents a long-awaited transformation of maritime and industrial land into mixed-used housing with retail, marina, open space and parks. And Mayor Jean Quan led the charge to build a new Coliseum City that will attract more business, create jobs, and support our sports teams; now therefore, be it
