Assembly Bill 865 would establish the EmPower California Act, which would require recipients of California Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (CA Energy Commission) funding to annually report on and develop a plan for boosting their women-, minority-, disabled veteran-, and LGBT-owned business procurement efforts, as well as require the CA Energy Commission to establish a Diversity Task Force and guidelines for fund recipients.
