RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt:

A Resolution Amending Resolution No. 85277 C.M.S., Which Authorized Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-2015 Cultural Services Grants, To Correct The Name Of The Individual Artist Grantee Ramon Ramos Alayo.

OUTCOME

This amendment to previously adopted Resolution No. 85277 C.M.S. will make it possible to disburse a cultural services grant already approved in the amount of \$4,999 to Oakland-based artist Ramon Ramos Alayo Resolution No 85277 C.M.S is attached hereto as *Attachment A*

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

On November 18, 2014, City Council adopted Resolution No. 85277 C M S, which authorized the City Administrator to enter into 86 cultural services grants with 71 Oakland-based nonprofit organizations and individual artists providing arts and cultural services in Oakland during Fiscal Year 2014-2015 in a total amount not to exceed \$950,000.

Among the recommended grants was a \$4,999 grant to Ramon Ramos Alayo to support production and presentation of a new Cuban dance work at Laney College Theater in Oakland. In preparing the report and resolution text, staff erroneously listed Mr. Alayo's name as "Ramon Ramos Ramos" When staff came to execute the grant agreement, the error was discovered and

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it was determined that an agreement in the grant recipient's correct name could not be issued without an amendment to the resolution

ANALYSIS

This resolution will correct Mr. Alayo's name for purposes of the grant award and allow City staff to complete execution of the agreement with Mr. Alayo to provide cultural services for the benefit of Oakland residents and visitors

There is no change to the scope of services

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

Cultural Funding Program staff's intent to seek Council approval for the recommended amendment to Resolution No. 85277 C.M.S was agendized and discussed at the March 11, 2015 meeting of the Funding Advisory Committee, which approved the recommendation The meeting was attended by the public and no objection was made to the proposed amendment

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO EIGHTY-SIX (86) CULTURAL SERVICES GRANTS TO SEVENTY-ONE (71) OAKLAND-BASED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS AND INDIVIDUAL ARTISTS PROVIDING ARTS AND CULTURAL SERVICES IN OAKLAND DURING FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015 IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$950,000

WHEREAS, in 1985, City Council adopted the first arts funding policies and procedures for the City of Oakland, establishing a panel system of evaluating funding proposals and distributing City funds to the arts; and

WHEREAS, the Cultural Funding Program is the City's funding mechanism to support Oaklandbased nonprofit organizations and artists providing arts and cultural activities to the public; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Cultural Funding Program is to fund Oakland-based art and cultural activities that reflect the diversity of the city for citizens of and visitors to Oakland, focusing on the key areas of General Support, Neighborhood Arts, and Arts Education, through four grantmaking categories for Individual Artist Projects, Organization Projects, Organizational Support, and Art in the Schools; and

WHEREAS, during August, 2014, three funding review panels convened and forwarded recommendations to award eighty-six (86) grants to seventy-one (71) organizations and individual artists proposing to provide arts and cultural programming in the city of Oakland; and

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2014, the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee met to review the grant recommendations received from the review panels, and voted unanimously to recommend to City Council that these grants be funded in the amounts listed herein;

WHEREAS, Fiscal Year 2014-15 funds for the Cultural Funding Program are budgeted as follows. \$730,000 in General Purpose Fund (1010), CCAD-Cultural Programs Org (90523). Undetermined Project (0000000); and \$220,000 from the Transient Occupancy Tax surcharge, which will be reserved for arts grants in the Measure C: Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) Surcharge Fund (2419), Cultural Arts & Marketing Org (85511), Cultural Funding Program TOT Project (P391850); and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland Funding Advisory Committee recommends specific funding to nonprofit organizations and individual artists as follows:


