The Committee approved the ordinance as amended to read as follows:

1. Section 3. Membership & Quorum. (a) The Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, at least six (6) of whom are Oakland residents. Pursuant to Section 601 of the Charter, members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Mayor subject to confirmation by the affirmative vote of five members of the Council. Each Councilperson shall nominate for the Mayor's consideration his/her own recommendation for Commission member. Notwithstanding such recommendation, the Mayor retains full appointment authority pursuant to the Charter.

2. Section 3. Membership & Quorum. (g) All members of the Privacy Commission shall be persons who have an interest in privacy rights as demonstrated by work experience, civic participation, and/or political advocacy. No member may be an elected official. Members of the Privacy Commission may represent the following criteria to the extent possible: (1) an attorney, legal scholar, or activist with expertise in privacy, civil rights, or a representative of an organization with expertise in the same; (5) a member of an organization which focuses on government transparency and openness or an individual, such as a former government employee, with experience working on government transparency and openness.

Upon the reading of Item 9.3 by the City Clerk, the Public Hearing was opened at 8:18 p.m. 8 individuals spoke on this item. Vice Mayor Kaplan made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Gallo, to close the Public Hearing, and hearing no objections, the motion passed by 7 Ayes: Brooks, Campbell Washington, Gallo, Guillén, Kalb, Kaplan and Council President Gibson McElhaney, and 1 Absent - Reid.

Vice Mayor Kaplan made substitute a motion, seconded by Councilmember Gallo, to adopt the ordinance with the additional amendment: "As part of the DDA, \$100,000 of the Parking Purchase Price will be retained in escrow at closing until the earlier to occur of (a) the date that is 2 years after a Certificate of Completion has been issued for the Project, or (b) the date that Developer has entered into leases for 80% of the retail space. However, a proportional amount of the money retained in escrow will be released to Developer concurrently with Developer's execution of a lease for a portion of the retail space. By way of example, if 40% of the space is leased immediately, \$50,000 will be released to Developer, continuing until the retail space is 80% leased. If more than 20% of the retail space remains unleased after such 2 year period, the balance of the funds left in escrow will be released to the City." The motionfailed with a vote of 5 Noes, 3 Ayes - Kalb, Kaplan, and Reid.

Councilmember Kalb made a motion, seconded by Vice Mayor Kaplan, to close the Public Hearing, and hearing no objections, the motion passed by 8 Ayes: Brooks, Campbell Washington, Gallo, Guillén, Kalb, Kaplan, Reid and Council President Gibson McElhaney.

Councilmember Kalb made a motion, seconded by Kaplan, to amend the Ordinance as follows:

1) Remove the following language from the Oakland Planning Code section 17.103.080(A)(3) "Owner Occupancy. The legal owner shall occupy either the primary dwelling or the Secondary Unit. Prior to issuance of a building permit for a Secondary Unit, the applicant shall record as a deed restriction in the Alameda County Recorder's Office, notice of this requirement, in a form prescribed by the Director of City Planning;"

2) Add the following to section 17.103.080(A)(5)(b) "For new or newly legalized Secondary Units established after the effective date of this Subsection and located within a residential parking permit area, a residential parking permit shall not be issued to the occupant(s) of the Secondary Unit may be issued no more than one (1) of the permits associated with the primary dwelling unit. This Subsection only applies to Secondary Units located on sites near transit as defined in Subsection (a) above;"

3) Revise section 17.103.080 (A)(5) to read as follows: "Required Parking. Except as specified in Subsection (a) below the minimum parking requirements for a Secondary Unit shall be as prescribed in the applicable individual zone regulations and in Chapter 17.116. Tandem parking may be permitted according to the regulations in Section 17.116.240;"

4) Revise section 17.103.080(A)(5)(a) to read as follows: "Secondary Units that are located on sites (i) within one-half (1/2) mile of a BART Station, BRT Station, or Major Transit Stop, (ii) within one half (1/2) mile of a designated rapid bus line not located on Telegraph Avenue, or (iii) within one-quarter (1/4) mile of a designated rapid bus line on Telegraph Avenue shall have no additional parking requirement. For the purposes of this Chapter, a "Major Transit Stop" is defined consistent with California Public Resources Code Section 21064.3, as may be amended; and means a site containing an existing rail transit station, a ferry terminal served by either a bus or rail transit service, or the intersection of two (2) or more major bus routes with a frequency of service interval of fifteen (15) minutes or less during the morning and afternoon peak commute periods.

5) Revise section 17.116.060(A) to read as follows:
a) One-family Dwelling with Secondary Unit
i) RH, RD, RM-1, and RM-2 Zones, except when combined with the

S-12 Zone: One (1) space for the Secondary Unit unless the lot already contains a total of at least three (3) spaces or is located near transit Pursuant to Section 17.103.080; however, when combined with the S-11 Zone, the requirement shall be one (1) space for each bedroom in any Secondary Unit, up to a maximum requirement of two (2) spaces per Secondary Unit. See Section 17.103.080.

ii) D-LM Zones, except when combined with the S-12 Zone: No additional space required for the Secondary Unit.

iii) All other zones, except when combined with the S-12 Zone: One (1) space for the Secondary Unit unless the lot already contains a total of at least two (2) spaces or is located near transit pursuant to Section 17.103.080; however, when combined with the S-11 Zone, the requirement shall be one (1) space for each bedroom in any Secondary Unit, up to a maximum requirement of two (2) spaces per Secondary Unit. See Section 17.103.080.

iv) Any zone combined with the S-12 Zone: See Section 17.94.040; and

The Council approved the introduction of the ordinance as amended as follows:

1) Section 9.37.030 "Definitions" to read as follows:

a) "Locked Container" means a lock box that is listed on the California Department of Justice Bureau of Firearms roster of approved firearm safety devices and that is locked and secured from entry by an unauthorized user;" and

b) "Unattended" means a vehicle that is parked or standing in the public right of way or public place within the City and which is not occupied and/or is outside the immediate control of the Person responsible for the vehicle."

2) Section 9.37.40(D) "Prohibitions" to read as follows: Unless exempted by law, firearms and ammunition inside Unattended Vehicles must be secured and secured as follows: (1) In a Lock Box; and (2) The Lock Box must be sotred (a) in the locked Trunk of the vehicle; or (b) the Lock Box must be stored inside the Vehicle in a place where the Lock Box cannot be seen from the outside or the Lock Box must be placed in a container that is permanently attached to the inside of the Vehicle; and (3) The key or other disabling device to the Lock Box is not left in the Unattended Vehicle.

3) Section 9.37.60 "Exemptions" to read as follows: This Chapter does not apply to persons authorized by state or federal law to carry or transport firearms or ammunition in Vehicles. To the extent there is a conflict between this Chapter and state or federal, the more stringent requirements shall govern.

4) Section 9.37.80 section title to read: "Civil Penalties."

5) Section 9.37.110 "Remedies not exclusive" to read as follows: "Remedies under this Chapter are cumulative and not exclusive. They are in addition to any other administrative, civil and/or criminal remedies provided by state, federal or other laws contained in the Oakland Muniipal Code. The City may seek an order for award of attorney's fees. Remedies may be recovered by all appropriate legal means, including but not limited to criminal prosecution, civil action, nuisance abatement or lien proceedings. Concealed Carry Licensees also may be subject to suspension or revocation of their licenses for violations of this Chapter.






