RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing Reallocation Of The East Bay Regional Park District Open Space, Wildlife, Shoreline, And Parks Bond (Measure WW Bond) Local Grant Program Fund For Laurel Park Project (No. C377110) In The Amount Of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) To The Allendale Recreation Center Project (Number To Be Established); And Authorize The City Administrator Or Designee To Re-Apply And Reallocate The Grant Funds From East Bay Regional Park District For The Measure WW Bond.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of this resolution will authorize the reallocation of Measure WW Bond fund appropriated for the Laurel Park project to the Allendale Recreation Center project to maximize the use of the available Measure WW funds for parks capital improvement program.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Measure WW Bond - East Bay Regional Park Districts Open Space, Wildlife, Shoreline, and Parks Bond was approved by voters in 2008. The measure allocates 25% of the bond as Local Grant Program funds to cities and special park districts on a per capita basis, which provides a total of \$19.2 million for the City of Oakland over the course of the bond.

In October 2008, under Resolution No. 81586 C.M.S., the Council approved a list of 16 potential capital improvement projects eligible for the City's Local Grant Program fund. See Attachment A for the resolution and list of projects.

In February 2009, Council approved Resolution No. 81777 C.M.S., to receive \$19.2 million from Measure WW Local Grant Program and appropriated the funds among the 16 capital improvement projects.

Since 2009, Council has approved various resolutions reallocating funds from projects that are unable to proceed due to land tenure issue, or projects completed under budget with remaining balance reallocated to other projects in order to maximize the use of Measure WW fund. The resolutions are:

- Resolution No. 83481 C.M.S., July 19, 2011, for Leveling Playing Fields project
- Resolution No. 83722 C.M.S., February 21, 2012, for reallocation of funds to Golden Gate Recreation Center
- Resolution No. 83781 C.M.S., April 3, 2012, for reallocation of funds to Peralta Hacienda Historical Park- De Anza Trail
- Resolution No. 84240 C.M.S., March 5, 2013, for reallocation of funds to Chabot Space and Science Center Outdoor Camp
- Resolution No. 85055 C.M.S., June 17, 2014, for reallocation of funds to various park projects
- Resolution No. 85494 C.M.S., March 31, 2015, for allocation of funds for Public Art

Since the start of the bond program to-date, staff has completed 12 projects and 10 are in progress two of which are near completion. See *Attachment B* for Project list and current status summary. As a continuation of the objective to maximize the use of Measure WW funds, the proposed reallocation of the Laurel Park project to the Allendale Recreation Center Project will allow the City to deliver another project before the grant deadline.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

The proposed reallocation of funds originally appropriated for the Laurel Park Project is necessary due to lack of available sites and pending bond fund end date. The proposed reallocation will transfer the originally allocated \$500,000 from the Laurel Park project to the Allendale Recreation Center renovation/remodeling project.

Laurel Park is one of the original 16 projects identified for Measure WW funds in 2009. The Laurel District has no community parks to serve the neighborhood. Despite six years of effort to identify possible park sites and develop various options, including partnering with the Oakland Unified School District, no site has been found for the development of a new park.

While the effort will continue in searching for a potential park site, the Measure WW fund deadline will sunset in December 2018. East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD) requires completion of project fund expenditures by mid-2018 and completes reimbursement by the end of 2018. The schedule to implement a public capital project requires a substantial timeline. It's necessary at this time to identify a project and scope that can be completed within the remaining timeline.

Allendale Recreation Center is within Council District 4 and nearest to the Laurel community. The Recreation Center is an aging facility with deferred improvement needs. The Measure WW funds will provide a minor update to the aging building and extend the life of the program spaces. Project scope will be determined with input from the Office of Parks & Recreation and Public Works Facilities Services.

FISCAL IMPACT

Allendale Recreation Center:

The \$500,000.00 funds established for the Laurel Park project is currently in Project No. C377110, Measure WW Bond Fund (2260), Capital project org. 92270, Account 56611. The funds will be reallocated to a new project to be established for Allendale Recreation Center Renovation (project number to be determined).

The improvements will be designed in collaboration with Office of Parks and Recreation (OPR) and the Public Works Bureau of Facilities & Environment to incorporate practical improvements that maintain or reduce existing maintenance costs and enhance the facility for program use. The proposed improvements are expected to address deferred capital needs and extend the useful life of the facility components.

Measure WW fund overall review:

Measure WW Local Program Grant total is \$19.204 million. A summary of the fund status as of December 30, 2015 is shown below:

PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST

Working with Office of Parks & Recreation during project implementation phase, staff and design team will outreach to the community and users for priority project scope input. In addition, staff will present the project to Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission and obtain necessary planning permits, if needed. Through the various input avenues, the design process will incorporate priority scopes to match the budget for implementation.

COORDINATION

The report has been coordinated with the Office of the Parks and Recreation and within Public Works Departments – Facilities, Parks & Tree Services, and Project Delivery Divisions. The report has been reviewed by the Office of the City Attorney and Controller's Bureau.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The project will improve an existing aging facility and extends the usability of the facility. Implementation of the project will create opportunities for businesses that are contracted with the City or provide materials & supplies to those contracted with the City. It helps generate jobs for Oakland residents and provides business tax, sales tax, and other revenues for the City by those who work on the projects.

Environmental: The design and construction of the projects will meet City's sustainability policies and requirements to minimize maintenance and reduce natural resource use. Contractors will be required to use recycled materials to the extent feasible and are required to recycle construction debris in accordance with City standards.

Social Equity: The project will improve the facility and allow recreational opportunities to continue for the public and the community. Projects will be required to meet requirements for accessibility to persons with disabilities and senior citizen. All new facilities will be in compliance with the physical access requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) which will facilitate equal access and opportunity.

CEQA

CEQA analysis and approvals will be obtained as the project is implemented and as part of the project application process to East Bay Regional Park District.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ALLOCATION OF NINETEEN MILLION TWO HUNDRED FOUR THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX DOLLARS (\$19,204,456) FROM THE REGIONAL OPEN SPACE, WILDLIFE, SHORELINE AND PARKS BOND (2008 MEASURE WW) TO VARIOUS OAKLAND PARKS AND OPEN SPACE RENOVATION PROJECTS INCLUDING, THE EAST OPEN SPORTS COMPLEX, CALDECOTT TRAIL, OWEN JONES FIELD, POPLAR FIELD, CENTRAL RESERVOIR FIELD, BUSHROD PARK SOCCER FIELD, 25TH STREET MINI-PARK, MORCOM ROSE GARDEN, FEATHER RIVER CAMP, CHILDREN'S FAIRYLAND, PAL CAMP, LAZEAR BALLFIELD, CITY STABLES, LAUREL PARK, MADISON SQUARE PARK AND RAIMONDI PARK

WHEREAS, The Regional Open Space, Wildlife, Shoreline and Parks Bond (2008 Measure WW) will be placed on the November 4, 2008 ballot in Alameda and Contra Costa Counties; and

WHEREAS, the bond measure would provide five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000) in funding to permanently protect open space, ridgelands and shorelines for future generations; and

WHEREAS, twenty-five percent (25%) or one hundred twenty-five million dollars (\$125,000,000) of the bond revenue would go directly to local parks and recreation departments and special park districts on a per capita basis to meet local park needs; and

WHEREAS, fifty million four hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$50,420,000) of the bond revenue would go to twelve regional park projects in Oakland, including the Oakland Shoreline, Martin Luther King Jr. Shoreline, Oyster Bay, Gateway Shoreline, Lake Chabot, Anthony Chabot, Dunsmuir Heights, Leona Open Space, Redwood, Roberts, Sibley/Huckleberry and Oak Knoll to Ridge Trail; and

WHEREAS, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) of the bond revenue would go directly to the Oakland Zoo for capital projects; and

WHEREAS, Oakland would receive nineteen million two hundred four thousand four hundred fifty-six dollars (\$19,254,456) in local share funding from this measure for parks and recreation capital needs; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: that upon passage of The Regional Open Space, Wildlife, Shoreline and Park Bond (2008 Measure WW) and receipt of the bond revenues, the City Council will allocate their local share of \$19,204,456 from the bond revenues as follows:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING REALLOCATION OF THE EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT OPEN SPACE, WILDLIFE, SHORELINE, AND PARKS BOND (MEASURE WW BOND) — LOCAL GRANT PROGRAM FUND FOR LAUREL PARK PROJECT (NO. C377110) IN THE AMOUNT OF FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000.00) TO THE ALLENDALE RECREATION CENTER PROJECT (NUMBER TO BE ESTABLISHED); AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR OR DESIGNEE TO RE-APPLY FOR AND REALLOCATE THE GRANT FUNDS FROM EAST BAY REGIONAL PARK DISTRICT FOR THE MEASURE WW BOND

WHEREAS, the people of the East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD) have enacted the Measure WW Park Bond Extension that provides funds for the acquisition and development of neighborhood, community, regional parks and recreation lands and facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Measure WW Bond provides for \$19.2 million Local Grant Program fund allocation to the City of Oakland; and

WHEREAS, the EBRPD Board of Directors has the responsibility for the administration of the grant program, setting up necessary procedures; and

WHEREAS, those procedures require the applicant's governing body to certify by resolution the approval of the applicant to apply for the local grant allocation of funds; and

WHEREAS, the City has enter into a master grant contract with the EBRPD; and

WHEREAS, the City has designated 16 projects to receive the grant fund under Resolution 81777 C.M.S. adopted in February 2009, including the development of the Laurel Park project; and

WHEREAS, the City is unsuccessful in securing land tenure required to develop the new Laurel Park Project

WHEREAS, Measure WW Bond program will sunset on December 31, 2018; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City of Oakland Council approve the reallocation of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from the EBRPD Measure WW Park Bond Extension Local Grant Program (Fund no. 2260) for Laurel Park project (no. C377110) to the Allendale Recreation Center Improvement project (number to be established); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Administrator or designee is authorized to re-apply for and reprogram grant funds allocated in 2009 for Laurel Park project (Resolution 81777 C.M.S.) from the EBRPD Local Grant Program under Measure WW Park Bond Extension and reallocate \$500,000.00 to the Allendale Recreation Center project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council certifies that the City has or will have sufficient funds to operate and maintain the Project(s); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council certifies that the City has reviewed, understands and agrees to the General Provisions contained in the contract shown in the EBRPD Procedural Guide; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council appoints the City Administrator or designee as agent to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to applications, agreements, amendments and payment requests that may be necessary for the completion of Project(s); and be it
