RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Awarding A Construction Contract To Beliveau Engineering Contractors Inc., The Lowest Responsive, Responsible Bidder, In Accordance With Plans And Specifications For The Construction Of Bellevue Ave. And Pathway Improvements Project (No. C393811) And With Contractor's Bid In The Amount Of Six Hundred Seventeen Thousand Ninety Five Dollars (\$617,095.00).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Approval of the resolution will allow the execution of a construction contract to complete the Bellevue Avenue and Pathway Improvement project. The work to be completed under this project is part of the Lake Merritt Master Plan and is located in Lakeside Park. The project will provide improved access to Lakeside Park and the Garden Center (Attachment A).

BACKGROUND/LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

This report requests Council's authorization to execute a construction contract to complete the Bellevue Avenue and Pathway Improvement project.

Funding for this project is provided by Measure DD and the Americans With Disabilities Act Capital Improvement Project fund. The project was approved by the City Council as part of Resolution No. 84914 C.M.S., April 1, 2014 approving the reallocation of Measure DD Bond Series 2009B proceeds.

Bellevue Avenue provides the majority of parking within Lakeside Park. Additionally, the Lake Merritt Master Plan calls for moving off street parking away from the lake and onto Bellevue Avenue.

When plans for improvements to the Sailboat House Shoreline were prepared, 41 spaces were eliminated and designated for replacement on Bellevue Avenue. This mandate created the opportunity to address a number of improvements on Bellevue Avenue, as detailed below.

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This project will not only improve the appearance and functionality of Bellevue Avenue, but will add new bicycle transportation and water quality improvements. The project incorporates improvements to the roadway layout that will encourage reduced travel speeds within the park, in keeping with the park setting, and provide a new bike path along Bellevue Avenue through Lakeside Park. Entrance and exit gates will be added to prevent unauthorized vehicular access to the park and discourage park usage after hours.

Specifically, the work consists of pavement overlay and restriping; improved access and egress controls at entry and exit points of Bellevue Avenue and Lakeside Park; improved parking and a new bike path along Bellevue Avenue with no net loss of parking; way finding signage; resurfacing of some existing pedestrian pathways with concrete; replace concrete walkway and entry plaza to the Garden Center building; relocation and electrical upgrade of the park entry kiosk; addition of bollards as required to control vehicular access to pathways behind Fairyland; planting and irrigation at the new permeable-surface overflow parking lot; and chain link fence realignment at the backside of the demonstration gardens.

The project was issued for bid on November 3, 2015. Construction is anticipated to begin in March 2016 and should be completed by Summer 2016, weather permitting.

ANALYSIS

On December 3, 2015, the City Clerk received three bids from Beliveau Engineering Contractors (BEC) Inc., McGuire and Hester, and Redgwick Construction Company. All three bids were deemed responsive and responsible. Beliveau Engineering Contractors Inc. bid of \$617,095 was the lowest bid and therefore is recommended for the award. Staff has reviewed the bid and has deemed that it is reflective of the current construction bidding environment.

Under the proposed contract with Beliveau Engineering Contractors Inc., the Local Business Enterprise and Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) participation will be 89.84%, which exceeds the City's 50% LBE/SLBE requirement. The contractor also shows a participation of 100.00% for trucking, which exceeds the 50% Local Trucking requirement. The contractor is required to have 50% of the work hours performed by Oakland residents and 50% of all new hires on the project (on a craft-by-craft basis) are to be Oakland residents. The LBE/SLBE information has been verified by the Social Equity Division of the Department of Contracting and Purchasing and is shown in *Attachment B*.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total one-time cost to implement the construction of this project is \$617,095.00. This project is funded by Measure DD Series B funding.

On-going Maintenance: The maintenance efforts will remain relatively the same or less as improvements are made to Bellevue Avenue and the Garden Center entry. These project repairs address part of the deferred street maintenance backlog. Additional maintenance may be incurred over time to address the new permeable parking; however there are no short term additional maintenance needs.

PUBLIC OUTREACH/INTEREST

A series of stakeholder meetings were held during the design of this project in 2012/13. Input was received and used to inform the basis of the design. Specifically, stakeholders expressed a desire for the new Garden Center entrance paving and the new bike path on Bellevue Avenue. Additionally, the project was presented to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) on February 17, 2014, and approved.

Prior to starting construction, signage will be posted to inform park users of the construction schedule and will include contact information of the contractor and the City's construction manager.

PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

BEC has completed six projects in the past three years for the City of Oakland. A series of evaluations on file for BEC's past projects are satisfactory. The most recent project they have completed is the Safe Routes to School: Cycle 10 (SR2S10), which was completed on June 16, 2015. The contract amount was \$143,168. The Contractor Performance Evaluation was satisfactory. (See Attachment C)

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The Bellevue Ave. and Pathways project improves paving conditions on Bellevue Ave., provides a bike lane and additional parking, along with a new concrete entry to the Garden Center. Construction contracts create job opportunities for local contractors. Infrastructure improvements reflect well on the community and indirectly improve the business climate.

Environmental: All construction debris will be recycled to the extent possible. The contractor will be required to make every effort to use Best Management Practices for the protection of storm water runoff during construction.

Social Equity: This project includes curb ramp and sidewalk improvements to help Oakland move closer to an accessible City benefiting all residents. Lakeside Park is a widely used open space area. The improvements in the park will benefit all park users.

CEQA

The project is exempt under CEQA Guidelines sections 15301 (existing facilities) and 15302 (replacement or reconstruction), each of which provides a separate and independent basis for CEQA clearance.

Staff recommends that the City Council approve a resolution awarding a construction contract to Beliveau Engineering Contractors Inc., for the construction of the Bellevue Avenue and Pathway Improvements (Project No. C393811) in the amount of Six Hundred Seventeen Thousand Ninety Five Dollars (\$617,095.00).



The Resident Engineer will prepare the Contractor Performance Evaluation and submit it to the Supervising Civil Engineer. The Supervising Civil Engineer will review the Contractor Performance Evaluation to ensure adequate documentation is included, the Resident Engineer has followed the process correctly, the Contractor Performance Evaluation has been prepared in a fair and unbiased manner, and the ratings assigned by the Resident Engineer are consistent with all other Resident Engineers using consistent performance expectations and similar rating scales.

The Resident Engineer will transmit a copy of the Contractor Performance Evaluation to the Contractor. Overall Ratings of Outstanding or Satisfactory are final and cannot be protested or appealed. If the Overall Rating is Marginal or Unsatisfactory, the Contractor will have 10 calendar days in which they may file a protest of the rating. The Public Works Agency Assistant Director, Design & Construction Services Department, will consider a Contractor's protest and render his/her determination of the validity of the Contractor's protest. If the Overall Rating is Marginal, the Assistant Director's determination will be final and not subject to further appeal. If the Overall Rating is Unsatisfactory and the protest is denied (in whole or in part) by the Assistant Director, the Contractor may appeal the Evaluation to the City Administrator, or his/her designee. The appeal must be filed within 14 calendar days of the Assistant Director's ruling on the protest. The City Administrator, or his/her designee, will hold a hearing with the Contractor within 21 calendar days of the filing of the appeal. The decision of the City Administrator regarding the appeal will be final.

Contractors who receive an Unsatisfactory Overall Rating (i.e., Total Score less than 1.0) will be allowed the option of voluntarily refraining from bidding on any City of Oakland projects within one year from the date of the Unsatisfactory Overall Rating, or of being categorized as non-responsible for any projects the Contractor bids on for a period of one year from the date of the Unsatisfactory Overall Rating. Two Unsatisfactory Overall Ratings within any five year period will result in the Contractor being categorized by the City Administrator as non-

responsible for any bids they submit for future City of Oakland projects within three years of the date of the last Unsatisfactory overall rating.

Any Contractor that receives an Unsatisfactory Overall Rating is required to attend a meeting with the City Administrator, or his/her designee, prior to returning to bidding on City projects. The Contractor is required to demonstrate improvements made in areas deemed Unsatisfactory in prior City of Oakland contracts.

The Public Works Agency Contract Administration Section will retain the final evaluation and any response from the Contractor for a period of five years. The City shall treat the evaluation as confidential, to the extent permitted by law.
