RECOMMENDATION

REASON FOR THE SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

The Public Safety Committee on December 15, 2015 approved the recommendation of staff, and forwarded it to the City Council, to approve the resolution authorizing the City Administrator, Or Designee, To Accept vehicles from OSPD. The Committee also requested additional information: 1) proof that the Oakland Unified School District had declared the vehicles as surplus property; and 2) additional information in regards to the Oakland Public Works (OPW) Department's methodology for its vehicle operations and maintenance (O&M) charges.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

OUSD Declaration of Vehicles as Surplus Property

Attachment A shows that on December 2, 2015, the OUSD Board of Education passed Resolution No. 1516-0133 which declared one Harley Davidson Road King motorcycle as surplus property. Attachment B shows that on January 28, 2015 the OUSD Board of Education passed Resolution No. 1415-0145, which declared three Harley Davidson Road King motorcycles, two Suzuki motorcycles, and one Chevrolet van as surplus property.

OPW Equipment Services Division Explanation of OPW O&M Costs

The Equipment Services Operations and Maintenance (O&M) rates include additional functions and services in addition to the standard repair and maintenance required of all equipment. Equipment Services program costs are built into each Department's O&M rates. These rates are spread across all equipment in the City fleet and are charged to customer departments on a monthly basis. The rates include vehicle replacement when the existing unit is no longer serviceable due to age or excessive repair costs. Using this methodology, Equipment Services has been able to replace 260 aged and unserviceable vehicles for OPD over the past three years, with a value of over \$13 million dollars.

In addition to replacement vehicle acquisitions, the Equipment Services O&M rates include the following services and program support for city departments:

- All vehicle service, repair, and maintenance functions
- Warranty repairs and recall/Technical Service Bulletin management
- Vehicle up-fitting, fabrication and modification
- Fueling operations
- Emergency and disaster response designated fueling source
- Roadside assistance, towing and after hours support
- Regulatory compliance and reporting (Air Resource Board diesel rule, smog check, opacity checks)
- Biennial Inspection of Terminal program
- Vehicle safety and accident total loss recovery programs
- Vehicle and equipment operator training program
- Equipment specification, procurement, and disposition
- Third party vendor contract establishment and management
- License/titling/registration
- Parking and toll evasion citation resolution
- Loaner vehicle program
- Equipment usage and fuel reporting
- City vehicle and equipment sustainability initiatives
- Vehicle-related grant writing assistance
- Automatic Vehicle Locator (AVL) program
- Replacement radio costs at end-of-equipment lifecycle (OPD and Oakland Fire Department (OFD)
- Replacement MDT (vehicle laptop) costs at end-of-equipment lifecycle (OPD and OFD)

The information contained in this supplemental report shows that OUSD has the resources to provide these vehicles to Oakland and that OPW has the resources to maintain them.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

OPD requests approval of a resolution authorizing acceptance of six motorcycles, one vehicle trailer, and one van from the OSPD. These vehicles no longer align with OSPD's mission and OSPD is prepared to donate them to OPD. The motorcycles are newer than current OPD motorcycles. OPD does not have any trailers and will use the trailer for a variety of transport operations. The van will support OPD's Tactical Operations Team equipment transport.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

OPD maintains a fleet of vehicles to support operations and divisions. OPD primarily relies on automobiles for regular patrol units. OPD uses motorcycles primarily for traffic enforcement. In 2015. OPD expanded its traffic enforcement operations to focus more extensively on traffic safety throughout the City. OPD uses trailers to occasionally transport motorcycles and other equipment.

All OPD vehicles have regular use-spans. These vehicles require constant maintenance to ensure their operational capacity and must eventually be replaced. Despite the recent implementation of the School Safety Motor Unit, OPD does not have funds to purchase new motorcycles. Vehicle transfers from other agencies help OPD maintain its fleet, given current budget restrictions.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

OSPD is providing six motorcycles, a vehicle trailer, and a van to OPD. The six motorcycles are as follows:

- Three 2009 Harley Davidson Road King motorcycles
- One 2010 Harley Davidson Road King motorcycle
- Two 2008 Suzuki Dual Sport DR650 motorcycles

Additionally, OSPD is providing one 2009 Haulmark Trailer for transporting motorcycles and other equipment. OSPD is providing one 1980 Chevrolet Panel Van which is useful for transporting multiple officers. OSPD is offering these vehicles to OPD because they no longer fit OSPD's mission of protecting students on campus. These vehicles do support OPD's comprehensive operations which include traffic patrols and personnel transport.

OPD currently has 28 Harley Davidson motorcycles. Twenty-four of these vehicles are in service and assigned to staff. The other four are used as used only for training. The latest model year is 2007. Since March 2015, OPD has increased motor officer staffing by 11 officers; 9 of these officers formed the new School Safety Motor Unit and 2 officers are assigned to OPD's Criminal Investigations Division (CID). More motorcycles are needed to support these personnel additions. The 4 trainer motorcycles are in poor mechanical shape as well as poor cosmetic shape; they are not be deployed for regular patrol use. The receipt of the 4 newer-model Harley Davidson motorcycles allows OPD to create a reserve of motorcycles for use as trainers as well as for deployment needs.

OPD currently has 11 dual purpose bikes, similar to the Suzuki Dual Sport DR650 models. Officers use these bikes when assigned in specialized units, such as Crime Reduction Teams (CRT). These vehicles are also used for special events such as protests, festivals, sporting events (A's, Raiders and Warriors) and other crowd management events. These vehicles offer a high level of maneuverability and support many types of uses, beyond the standard road use of the Harley Davidsons.

OPD currently lacks a trailer to transport motorcycles and equipment, so the receipt of trailer will be a great benefit to OPD. The van is important as it will be used by the Tactical Operations Team to transport equipment. The van can be used for training exercises as well as operational field deployment for OPD units.

FISCAL IMPACT

OSPD is providing vehicles to OPD at no charge. However, OPD will need to: 1) install radios in the motorcycles and van; 2) pay to maintain the vehicles; and 3) pay for fuel costs. See the tables below for a detailed description of each of these costs expected to occur during the current Fiscal Year 2015-17 approved budget. The radio costs are based on a recent quote from Emergency Vehicle Outfitters (*Attachment A*). For the FY 2016-17, OPD is using a contingency rate of 15% for expected maintenance and repairs.

Fuel costs are difficult to estimate; some motorcycles will be deployed in motor units while others will be used for training. Some will be used more often depending on need. Similarly, OPD cannot predict how often the van will be used.

The FY 2015-17 Adopted Policy Budget has enough funding allocated to cover radio, O&M, and fuel costs. No additional funding is needed. Funding details are outlined in table 3 below.
