RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Authorizing The City Administrator To Apply For, Accept And Appropriate Cash Grants And Accept Non-Cash Grants From the Friends of the Oakland Public Library In The Cumulative Amount Notto-exceed \$1,000,000 Through June 30, 2021 For Use by the Oakland Public Library.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Adoption of this resolution will allow the City Administrator or her designee to apply for, accept and appropriate cash grants from the Friends of the Oakland Public Library (FOPL) and accept non-cash grants from FOPL, in the cumulative amount not-to-exceed \$1,000,000 through June 30, 2021. The Oakland Public Library depends on these grants to fund library programs, services and other needs that cannot be funded through the City of Oakland's budget. The Friends of the Oakland Public Library raises funds and makes these grants to the Library annually.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The Friends of the Oakland Public Library (FOPL) is a volunteer-led nonprofit 501 (c) (3) organization dedicated to supporting the Oakland Public Library since 1950. FOPL's mission is "to advance the role of the Oakland Public Library as a vital community resource and as an institution critical to the culture, education and welfare of our diverse community." FOPL raises funds by operating a quality used bookstore in Old Oakland (721 Washington Street) staffed primarily by volunteers and by offering a membership program through which over 900 individuals and families support the Oakland Public Library. FOPL also accepts donations, grants and bequests for the exclusive benefit of the Library. As a result of these activities, FOPL offers grants to the Oakland Public Library.

FOPL grants typically range from \$2,000 to \$20,000 to support a variety of programs, services, projects, and other needs including the Youth Poet Laureate program, Youth Leadership Council, Summer Reading Programs for all ages, Children's Programming, special programs

and collections, the 81st Avenue Library Capital Campaign (completed in 2010) and other major facilities projects, as well as volunteer programs and staff recognition.

Recent FOPL grants have been accepted and appropriated under Resolution 79714 C.M.S. dated, January 26, 2006, by which the City Administrator is authorized to accept and appropriate restricted grant funds, gifts and donations up to \$50,000 from a single grantor without City Council action. The grants have been reported in the annual report to City Council as required by Administrative Instruction Number 1052 which outlines the procedures for accepting such grants. However, as a result of the sustained efforts of the volunteer board of directors, FOPL's cumulative annual grants now exceed the \$50,000 limit.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

FOPL's contributions improve the quality of library services for all residents at no cost to the City. The proposed resolution furthers the goal of Resolution No. 79714 C.M.S. "to improve the City's efficiency in accepting, appropriating and utilizing grants in order to encourage the solicitation and offering of grants to the City and to facilitate their timely use by the City of the public's benefit." The alternative is to request authorization from City Council to accept and appropriate individual grants from FOPL, a process which decreases efficiency and increases the administrative costs of accepting these grants. The Council may also consider setting the grant limit at a lesser amount than \$1.0 million.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no direct fiscal impact on the City's General Purpose Fund. Funds received will be deposited and appropriated to the Oakland Public Library Trust Fund (7540). Project numbers will be assigned as necessary to facilitate reporting to the Grantor and to ensure that grant Funds are used as stipulated by the Grantor.

The authorization to accept and appropriate grants from FOPL will commence on the date of the approval of the resolution and continue until the earlier of June 30, 2021 or the time at which the \$1,000,000 grant amount is reached. It is anticipated that staff will return to Council to seek additional authorization to accept grants from FOPL as needed in the future.

PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST

No public outreach was conducted or required for the preparation of this report. The Friends of the Oakland Public Library promotes membership through book sales, a quarterly newsletter, a website (www.fopl.org), tabling at farmers' markets and book festivals, and participation in The East Bay Community Foundation's annual East Bay Gives.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: These grants provide support for the Oakland Public Library which offers programs and services available to all Oakland residents to enhance their educational and economic opportunities.

Social Equity: The services of the Oakland Public Library are available at no charge to all residents of all ages to acquire knowledge and develop skills they need to assure equity in educational, employment, housing, and community opportunities.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution authorizing the City Administrator to apply for, accept and appropriate cash grants and non-cash grants from the Friends of the Oakland Public Library to support a variety of programs, services, projects, and other needs in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,000,000 through June 30, 2021.
