

#### **Activity Highlights**

- ➤ Coordinated endorsement of four more **Kiva Zip** loans totaling \$40,000 for Oakland small businesses. Conducted two Kiva Zip Information Workshops in the Business Assistance Center (BAC). Special Kiva Oakland campaigns were conducted for Latham Square merchants and Spanish speaking merchants.
- Secured \$370,000 in **Broadway Shuttle** grants through the "Spare the Air" program by testifying at a Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) committee meeting and working with BAAQMD staff. These grants will help keep the B shuttles running without reducing service or using City General Fund money.
- ➤ Negotiated terms of a 30-month contract renewal with AC Transit to operate the **Broadway Shuttle** through December 2018. The contract includes no rate increase for first 15 months of the contract, and a 3.6% increase during the second 15 months.
- Facilitated \$2.2 million in assessment payments from the Alameda County Assessor to the 11 citywide **Business** Improvement Districts (BIDs)/Community Benefit Districts (CBDs).
- ➤ Collaborated with Council President Lynette Gibson McElhaney to participate in annual **International Council of Shopping Centers Real Estate Convention**. Met with developers and retail brokers regarding: The Ridge shopping center, Target, vacant Walmart space, Oak Knoll retail, proposed Fruitvale store, 1500 Broadway and 1911 Telegraph.
- ➤ Completed **Retail Attraction Brochure** featuring Broadway from Jack London Square to I-580 that describes retail potential along the corridor (square feet in the pipeline, demographics, existing national retailers, map). **See Attachment D**

- > Recruited members of Oakland's green and cleantech communities for **Energy and Climate Action Plan** focus group hosted by Environmental Services. Participants helped identify new or underutilized resources to cut greenhouse gases in Oakland.
- Supported 13th Street/Broadway Merchant Watch Group in the wake of the neighborhood's second fatal 2016 shooting by coordinating with OPD Neighborhood Services to facilitate meeting with Oakland Unite, the new owners of the Merchants Garage, and neighborhood merchants and property owners.
- ➤ Purchased \$4K in City advertising to support the **Chinook Book**, which promotes over 90 small Oakland businesses. Chinook provides online and hardcopy discounts at businesses offering green, organic, and locally made goods and services.
- ➤ Participated in **Bay Area Maker to Manufacturer** survey of four cities (San Francisco, Oakland, Fremont, San Jose) by creating new database of manufacturers in Oakland and circulating a survey about retention, expansion and location needs. Results will be published in November 2016 along with strategies to grow manufacturing in the Bay Area.
- ➤ Held three **Business Alert** meetings in West Oakland focusing on homeless encampment mitigation strategies for neighboring businesses. Engaged with members of Embarcadero Cove Business Alert to help mitigate negative conditions in Union Point Park and surrounding businesses. These meetings included coordination with the Port of Oakland, Coast Guard, Parks & Recreation, and Oakland Public Works Agency.


## GoldieBlox, Oakland Maker of Engineering Toys for Girls, Creates Kids' Coding App


#### Lake Merritt Affordable Housing Wins Design Award

One of Oakland's newest buildings, the 92-unit Lakeside Senior Apartment building, has won the prestigious <u>AIA-HUD</u> <u>Secretary's 2016 Design Award</u>. Designed by <u>David Baker Architects</u>, the new building provides homes for seniors, including formerly homeless seniors, just one block from the renovated Lake Merritt waterfront and within walking range of parks, playgrounds, restaurants, and shops. The building is topped by a fifth-floor suite of community spaces, including garden plots for residents, a community room, kitchen, outdoor decks and a wellness studio—all with spectacular lake and city views.

But the opportunity for movement creates or accelerates economic opportunities."



Fiscal Year 2015-2016 ended in June. The City of Oakland saw a substantial increase in this year's Real Estate Transfer Taxes as well as a continued increase in Transient Occupancy taxes. Sales taxes have declined primarily as a result of low fuel costs. Annual Business License revenues increased in part from the identification of undeclared rental properties.

# Quarterly City Revenues: Calendar Year Q2









#### City Revenue Streams 2013-2016







