RESOLUTION HONORING CRAIG STRUNK FOR 19 YEARS OF EXEMPLARY SERVICE TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND

WHEREAS, Mr. Strunk designed, implemented and maintained the Office's virtual infrastructure to provide data security, document management, email, remote access and all the other essential services; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Strunk pioneered new technologies including, but not limited to, the City's first Microsoft Exchange messaging system in 1998, the City's first Citrix server providing remote access to users in 2001, the City's first cull and review platform in 2008, the City's first production Hyper-V cluster (Virtual Server Farm) in 2011 and the City's first Virtual Desktop implementation in 2014; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Strunk spearheaded the City's eDiscovery efforts and played an important role in investigations of fraud and corruption as the City's only Certified Digital Forensic Investigator; and

WHEREAS, over the years, Mr. Strunk conducted countless trainings and acted as a mentor to numerous staff members and interns; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, Mr. Strunk's collegial personality, sense of humor and strong work ethic positively influenced the culture of the entire City Attorney's Office; now therefore be it
