RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH PERALTA COLLEGES FOUNDATION IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$80,000 FOR THE DESIGN AND PRODUCTION OF TWO TINY HOME PROTOTYPES

WHEREAS, approximately 1384 persons are living outside and unsheltered in the City of Oakland at any given time; and

WHEREAS, the solution to homelessness is housing; and

WHEREAS, City of Oakland has a shortage of affordable and permanent supportive housing; and

WHEREAS, many municipalities around the country are exploring uses for Tiny Homes as a method of addressing homelessness; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes have Laney College Carpentry Department design and produce two Tiny Home prototypes, a small model containing a space with a sleeping loft, and a medium model with a sleeping space, shower, toilet and kitchenette; and

WHEREAS, the design of these prototypes could be used in the future as a housing option to address homelessness in Oakland; and

WHEREAS, Peralta Colleges Foundation is serving as the fiscal agent for Laney College's Carpentry Department, which will design and build the prototypes using digital fabricator technology; and

WHEREAS, The Laney College Carpentry Department will retain the prototypes, and copyright to the tiny home prototypes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council approved funding for tiny house prototype in the 2016 midcycle budget; and **WHEREAS**, the funds are available in the amount of up to \$80,000 for the Tiny Home prototype as identified in the table below:
