WHEREAS, for over 50 years, the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) have provided vital support and resources to endeavors in the arts and humanities across the country and currently have a budget of \$148 million each; and

WHEREAS, the NEA and NEH efficiently use their limited budgets to leverage additional state, local and philanthropic funds to catalyze projects that reach almost every county in the country to ensure a wide reach of arts, music, dance, theater, literature, cultural history, and the visual arts that serve all Americans; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis determined that the Arts and Humanities sectors of the economy is a \$704 billion industry which accounts for 4.2 percent of the nation's GDP and has developed, in part, due to the investments of the NEA and NEH; and

RESOLVED: That the City of Oakland supports the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities and directs the Council President to issue a letter of support on behalf of the City Council to President Trump and Congress.
