

RECOMMENDATION

Staff Recommends That The City Council Adopt A Resolution Rejecting All Bids, Waiving Further Advertising And Competitive Bidding, And Authorizing The City Administrator, Or Designee, To Negotiate And Execute A Construction Contract Up To An Amount Of Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$910,000.00) In The Open Market For The Woodminster Amphitheater – Phase 2 Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) Improvements (Project No. 1000964) In Accordance With The Contract Documents, And To Allocate From Woodminster Miscellaneous Trust Fund (7999) Up To An Amount Of One Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$130,000.00) To The Capital Improvement Project Organization (92270) Under Project No. 1000964.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City issued a Notice of Inviting Bids for the Woodminster Theater - Phase 2 ADA Improvement project as part of Fiscal Year (FY) 2015-17 Budget approval. The apparent lowest bidder withdrew their bid claiming a clerical error. The remaining bids are significantly over the current construction estimate and budget and deemed non-compliant with the 50% Local and Small Local Business Enterprise (L/SLBE) participation requirements. Approval of the resolution will reject all bids and waive further advertising and competitive bidding per the Oakland Municipal Code (OMC) Section 2.04.050.I.5., and authorize the City Administrator or designee to negotiate and execute a construction contract for the Woodminster Amphitheater – Phase 2 ADA Improvements Project (No. 1000964) up to an amount of \$910,000 in the open market, and to allocate Woodminster Miscellaneous Trust Fund (7999) up to an amount of \$130,000.00 to the Capital Improvement Project (CIP) organization (92270) under the same Project (No. 1000964) to increase the construction budget. The work for this project is located in Council District 4 as shown in **Attachment A**.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Woodminster Amphitheater, located at 3300 Joaquin Miller Road in the Joaquin Miller Park, was constructed in the late 1930's as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project. This City

asset has a City historic rating of A, "highest importance," which places the amphitheater on the City's Local Register of Historical Resources for purposes including California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and State Historical Building Code. Woodminster Amphitheater is utilized to host various events and performances including graduation ceremonies, Woodminster Summer Musicals, and Sundays in the Redwoods.

The ADA improvements at Woodminster Amphitheater must be completed by December 31, 2018 to satisfy the facility related injunctive relief pursuant to an ADA lawsuit settlement involving the City (White v. Oakland). The Phase 1 ADA improvements for the upper amphitheater access features were completed in 2014. The Phase 2 ADA improvements entail the construction of new wheelchair accessible seats and other access improvements at the lower amphitheater that include accessible parking and a picnic area with compliant paths of travel. In addition, a new exterior prefabricated restroom accommodation is specified as an additive bid alternate for the project.

On June 30, 2015, the City Council approved Resolution No. 85672 C.M.S. adopting the FY 2015-17 Budget that included appropriation of General Purpose Fund (1010) for the Woodminster Phase 2 ADA Improvements project as well as appropriation of General Purpose Fund (1010) for On-Call ADA Capital Improvement Projects.

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission endorsed the project on February 8, 2017, and the Oakland Planning and Zoning Department approved the Conditional Use Permit (Permit No. PLN17024) on April 27, 2017.

On May 8, 2017, the Mayor's Commission on Persons with Disabilities (MCPD) passed a motion authorizing the City ADA Coordinator to reallocate \$217,700 from FY 2015-17 On-Call ADA Capital Improvement Projects Fund (1010) to supplement costs to install the new prefabricated restroom facility at the Woodminster Amphitheater as part of the Project.

ANALYSIS AND POLICY ALTERNATIVES

On April 20, 2017, the City Clerk received three bids. The bid summary is provided in *Attachment B*. Bay Construction was the apparent lowest bidder; however, on April 26, 2017, they requested a withdrawal of their bid and bid security, claiming a clerical error per the California Public Contract Code (CPCC) Section 5103. Bay Construction's bid is recommended to be rejected based on their claimed clerical error and inability to execute a contract.

The two remaining bids are significantly over the current construction estimate and budget for the project. In addition, according to the Compliance Analysis of the three bids included in *Attachment C*, the remaining two bids are deemed non-compliant with the City's L/SLBE Program requirements.

Therefore, staff recommends rejecting all bids and waiving further advertising and competitive bidding, in order for the City Administrator or designee to negotiate and execute a construction contract for the project up to an amount of \$910,000 in the open market, and to negotiate and authorize changes to scope of the project as specified in the contract documents. Further advertising and competitive bidding will delay the construction project which is already

anticipated to occur during the rainy season. Woodminster Amphitheater will be closed to public during the construction which is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2017 and completed by April 2018 for the amphitheater users and patrons to prepare for the 2018 performance season.

Waiver of Advertising and Competitive Bidding Requirements:

OMC Section 2.04.050 requires advertising and competitive bidding for contracts for the purchase of services, supplies or combination required by the City in any one transaction that exceeds \$50,000 and the award of the contract to the lowest responsible, responsive bidder if an award is made. OMC Section 2.04.050.I.5 provides an exception to the advertising and competitive bidding requirements upon a finding and determination by the City Council that it is in the best interests of the City to do so. In addition, OMC Section 2.04.050.J states that if no valid bids are received after advertising as required, the City Administrator may proceed to hire or have the services performed or purchase the supplies in the open market.

Thus, in accordance with OMC 2.04.050.1.5, staff recommends that it is in the City's best interests to waive further advertising and competitive bidding in order to meet the project schedule for the ADA lawsuit settlement. The City will negotiate to secure a contract in the open market that is within the project budget and that meets the City's contract compliance and program requirements.

FISCAL IMPACT

The completion of the Project is necessary to satisfy the requirements of the ADA lawsuit settlement before the deadline of December 31, 2018:

PAST PERFORMANCE, EVALUATION AND FOLLOW-UP

Past performances of the contractor for the Project shall be evaluated as part of the contract negotiation process and prior to the award of the negotiated contract.

PUBLIC OUTREACH / INTEREST

Staff coordinated the project with the Producers Associations and its Board of Directors who manage the Woodminster Summer Musicals and the Friends of Joaquin Miller Park. Public notifications will be posted prior to the start of the construction project.

COORDINATION

The work to be done under this contract was coordinated with the Oakland Parks and Recreation, Oakland Planning and Zoning, and OPW Bureau of Facilities and Environment, Contracts and Compliance Division, and ADA Programs Division. In addition, the Office of City Attorney and the Controller's Bureau have reviewed this report and resolution.

SUSTAINABLE OPPORTUNITIES

Economic: The contractors for the project shall be verified for Local Business Enterprise and Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) participation by the Social Equity Division of the Department of Contracting and Purchasing. The contractors are required to have 50 percent of the work hours performed by Oakland residents, and 50 percent of all new hires are to be Oakland residents, which will result in funds being spent locally.

Environmental: The contractor will be required to use recyclable construction materials to the extent feasible and is required to recycle construction debris in accordance with City standards. Also, Best Management Practices will be enforced for the protection of storm water runoff during construction.

Social Equity: The project will further improve the accessibility of the city facility to the people with disabilities and the public in general, thereby, benefiting all Oakland residents.

California Environmental Quality Act

The project is categorically exempt from the environmental review as the work is limited to improvements to an existing facility.

ACTION REQUESTED OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Adopt a resolution rejecting all bids, waiving further advertising and competitive bidding, and authorizing the City Administrator, or designee, to negotiate and execute a construction contract up to an amount of nine hundred ten thousand dollars (\$910,000.00) in the open market for the Woodminster Amphitheater – Phase 2 ADA Improvements (Project No. 1000964) in accordance with the contract documents, and to allocate from Woodminster Miscellaneous Trust Fund (7999) up to an amount of one hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$130,000.00) to the Capital Improvement Project organization (92270) under Project No. 1000964.



A RESOLUTION REJECTING ALL BIDS, WAIVING FURTHER ADVERTISING AND COMPETITIVE BIDDING, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR, OR DESIGNEE, TO NEGOTIATE AND EXECUTE A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT UP TO AN AMOUNT OF NINE HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$910.000.00) IN THE OPEN MARKET FOR THE WOODMINSTER AMPHITHEATER -PHASE 2 ADA IMPROVEMENTS (PROJECT NO. 1000964) IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, AND TO ALLOCATE FROM WOODMINSTER MISCELLANEOUS TRUST FUND (7999) UP TO AN AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$130,000.00) ТО THE CAPITAL **IMPROVEMENT** PROJECT ORGANIZATION (92270)UNDER **PROJECT NO. 1000964.**

WHEREAS, the Woodminster Amphitheater Phase 2 ADA Improvements Project must be completed by December 31, 2018, to satisfy the facility related injunctive relief pursuant to an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) lawsuit settlement involving the City (White v. Oakland); and

WHEREAS, the Phase 2 ADA improvements entail the construction of new wheelchair accessible seats and other access improvements at the lower amphitheater that include accessible parking, restroom accommodations, and a picnic area with compliant paths of travel; and

WHEREAS, the Phase 1 ADA improvements to the upper amphitheater access features, also part of the lawsuit settlement requirements, were completed in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Phase 2 construction project is anticipated to begin in the fall of 2017 and completed by April 2018 before the start of the 2018 performance season; and Woodminster Amphitheater will be closed to the public during the construction; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2017, the City Clerk received three bids for the project; and

WHEREAS, Bay Construction was the lowest apparent bidder, but, within the five-working days of the bid opening, Bay Construction requested a withdrawal of their bid and bid security claiming a clerical error per the California Public Contract Code (CPCC) Section 5103; and

WHEREAS, the two remaining bids are significantly over the current construction budget, and the bids were deemed non-compliant with the City's L/SLBE Program requirements; and

WHEREAS, OMC Section 2.04.050 I.5 provides an exception to the advertising and competitive bidding requirements of the OMC upon a finding and determination by the City Council that it is in the best interests of the City to do so; and

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WHEREAS, advertising and competitive bidding at this junction will delay the construction project which is already anticipated to occur during the rainy season, and the project has to be completed and the amphitheater reopened to the public by April 2018 for the amphitheater users and patrons to prepare for the 2018 performance season; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That all bids are hereby rejected; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Council finds and determine that it is in the best interest of the City to waive further advertising and competitive bidding per OMC Section 2.04.050.I.5; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or designee is authorized to negotiate and execute a construction contract for the Woodminster Amphitheater – Phase 2 ADA Improvements (Project No. 1000964) up to an amount of \$910,000 in the open market, and to execute amendments or modifications of the contract within the limitations of the contract documents; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the project funding is available through FY 2015-17 Capital Improvement Program Budget for Woodminster Phase 2 ADA Improvements Project (No. 1000964) and FY 2016-17 On-call ADA CIP appropriation under General Purpose Fund (1010); Organization (92270) Capital Improvement Project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or designee is authorized to allocate from the Woodminster Miscellaneous Trust Fund (7999) up to an amount of \$130,000.00 to the Capital Improvement Project (92270) organization for the Woodminster Phase 2 ADA Improvements Project (No. 1000964); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator or designee is authorized to negotiate, execute a construction contract up to an amount of \$910,000 in the open market; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Administrator, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute any amendments or modifications of said contract within the limitations of the specifications of the construction contract; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the cost to implement the Project is necessary to satisfy the injunction relief of the ADA lawsuit settlement before the deadline of December 31, 2018; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the plans and specifications prepared for this project, including any subsequent changes during construction, that will be reviewed and adopted by the Director, or designee, are hereby approved; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the contractors for the project shall be verified for Local Business Enterprise and Small Local Business Enterprise (LBE/SLBE) participation by the Social Equity Division of the Department of Contracting and Purchasing; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the successful contractor shall provide faithful performance bond and a bond to guarantee payment of all claims for labor and materials furnished and for the amount of 100% of the contract price and due under the Unemployment Insurance Act prior to execution of the contract; and be it **FURTHER RESOLVED:** That the contract shall be reviewed and approved by the City Attorney for form and legality prior to execution and placed on file in the Office of the City Clerk.
