RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO <u>ANALYZE</u> <u>POTENTIAL OPTIONS, COSTS, AND ASSOCIATED ISSUES FOR PROVIDING</u> GENDER-NEUTRAL RESTROOMS IN CITY-OWNED BUILDINGS, STARTING WITH <u>THE</u> CITY HALL <u>COMPLEX</u>, AND TO REPORT BACK TO THE PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE BY OCTOBER 10, 2017 ON THE PROGRESS OF THIS EFFORT

WHEREAS, restricting access to restrooms by gender creates problems of safety, bullying, fairness, and convenience; and

WHEREAS, a 2013 survey and report published by the Williams Institute at the UCLA School of Law found that gender-specific restrooms pose serious risks to transgender and gender non-conforming individuals; and

WHEREAS, due to bias and discrimination, 70 percent of survey respondents had reported being verbally harassed, denied access, or physically assaulted in public restrooms; and

WHEREAS, 27 percent of survey respondents experienced problems using restrooms at work that, in some cases, caused them to change jobs or leave their employer entirely; and

WHEREAS, 54 percent of survey respondents reported having some sort of physical problem from trying to avoid using public restrooms, such as dehydration, kidney infections, and urinary tract infections; and

WHEREAS, 58 percent of survey respondents reported that they have avoided going out in public due to a lack of safe public restroom facilities; and

WHEREAS, everyone in our community deserve access to safe, convenient, and unrestricted restroom access, which makes it possible to safely and equally participate in our government and civic institutions; and

WHEREAS, under California Assembly Bill 1732, the "Equal Restroom Access Act," single-occupancy restrooms in businesses, government buildings, and places of public accommodation must be designated as gender-neutral, and identified by "all gender" signage as of March 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, AB 1732 helps address the issues transgender and gender non-conforming people face when it comes to restroom access, but only where there currently exist single-occupancy restrooms; and

WHEREAS, it is important that workers and visitors to City Hall and other City-owned buildings have access to gender-neutral restrooms, in addition to the gender-specific restrooms on site; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Oakland City Council directs the City Administrator to <u>analyze potential options</u>, <u>costs</u>, <u>and associated issues for providing gender-neutral restrooms in City-owned buildings</u>, starting with <u>the City Hall complex</u>; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED: That the City Administrator will report back to the Public Works Committee by October 10, 2017 on the progress of this effort.
