## INTRODUCED BY COUNCILMEMBER KALB AND VICE MAYOR CAMPBELL WASHINGTON

## RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND HONORING ALL MEMBERS OF THE OAKLAND WILDFIRE PREVENTION ASSESSMENT DISTRICT (WPAD) ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR THEIR DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF OAKLAND SINCE 2004

**WHEREAS,** on October 20, 1991 a firestorm ravaged the Oakland Hills, claiming 25 lives, and destroying more than 3,500 homes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Oakland Wildfire Prevention Assessment District (WPAD) was formed by a ballot measure in 2003 by the city to help prevent wildfires in the Oakland Hills; and

WHEREAS, the residents of the Oakland Hills High Fire Severity Zone approved a 10year assessment starting in 2004 to fund goat grazing, road-side clearance and other vegetation management efforts on 1400 acres of city parcels within the Wildfire Prevention Assessment District (WPAD); and

**WHEREAS,** the approved ballot measure called for the formation of the WPAD Citizens Advisory Committee to oversee budget and expenditures of WPAD funds; and

WHEREAS, for the last fourteen years a group of dedicated volunteers represented the Hills communities by managing the assessment district, which includes the wooded areas throughout the Oakland Hills from the border with Berkeley to the border with San Leandro; and

WHEREAS, the volunteer board leaders for the District managed approximately \$1.7 million annually to ensure vegetation management of city owned properties, including roadside clearing, yearly goat grazing, the roving fire patrols on high-fire danger days, public education and outreach, and roadside chipping; and

WHEREAS, over the past 13 years, 38 residents served as volunteer members of the WPAD Citizen's Advisory Committee, sharing their professional and community-based expertise as fire fighters, project managers, park stewards, and wildfire prevention advocates in advising the Oakland Fire Department's Vegetation Management Unit on policy priorities and effective and efficient use of WPAD funds to reduce the risk of the spread of fires on City parcels and open spaces; and

WHEREAS, in addition to managing the WPAD funds, these volunteers continuously and tirelessly advocated for effective fire prevention measures on behalf of Oakland residents within the city; and WHEREAS, all WPAD funding will be exhausted or encumbered as of June 30, 2017; and

**WHEREAS,** the WPAD Advisory Committee's last official business meeting is June 15, 2017; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** that the City Council, the Mayor and the City of Oakland extend their sincere appreciation for the countless hours donated by the 38 volunteers of the WPAD Advisory Committee who served with passion, dedication and commitment towards reducing the risk of the spread of wildfire in the Oakland Hills, and recognize the following exemplary citizens for their many years of public service:
