## RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING OCTOBER 2017 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH IN THE CITY OF OAKLAND

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of Oakland, California seeks to enhance public welfare and promote justice for all citizens by declaring that the protection against domestic violence is a fundamental human right; and

**WHEREAS**, domestic violence is a global problem, with millions of annual incidents in the United States alone; and

**WHEREAS**, survivors of domestic violence must deal with the effects of physical injuries, long-term psychological damage, financial instability, difficulty securing employment, and trouble finding safe housing; and

WHEREAS, in many cases, traumatized children are the silent victims in homes where domestic violence occurs and this trauma has detrimental impacts upon a child's cognitive and emotional development, significantly increasing an exposed child's risk for behavioral problems during their childhood as well as the potential for becoming an abuser or engaging in criminal violence as an adult; and

**WHEREAS**, the Domestic Violence Unit of the Oakland Police Department (OPD) is one of the highest volume investigative units within OPD's Criminal Investigation Division, receiving nearly 300-400 reports per month; and

WHEREAS, the City of Oakland received 4,420 reports of domestic violence in 2017 (year to date) resulting in 1,870 charges (year to date) and 3,642 reports of domestic violence offenses in 2016 resulting in 3,056 charges, compared to 7,169 to 8,015 reports per year from 2010 to 2015, resulting in 455 to 913 charges per year; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence can escalate to loss of life, as 30 homicides in Oakland from 2009-2017 (year to date) were attributed to domestic violence incidents; and

WHEREAS, domestic violence programs in the City of Oakland, including some Oakland Unite programs, provide vital services to families, including crisis hotlines, emergency shelter, support programs for children and teenagers, public education, intervention and legal advocacy; and **WHEREAS**, the Alameda County Family Justice Center works collaboratively with the Oakland Police Department to coordinate efforts for victims, ensure appropriate case management, and share best practices, including direct training of OPD officers; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**: By the Oakland City Council that:

- 1. The City of Oakland recognizes October 2017 as Domestic Violence Awareness Month; and
- 2. The City Council encourages community members to learn about the resources available for victims of domestic violence and help hotlines where victims or witnesses of domestic violence can report such crimes.
